
The Burden of Noah and his Family

hen Noah's grandfather, Methuselah, and his father Lamech were alive, so was Adam and his son Seth. Also, Enos, Cainan, Mahalaleel, Jared and Enoch, the seventh from Adam, were all still alive. These "living" generations passed down knowledge of creation and of the first murder to all men.

When Noah was born, both Adam and Seth had died. After his birth, Enos, Cainan, Mahalaleel, Jared, Noah's father Lamech, and finally, Methuselah, the oldest man that ever lived, also died as <u>wickedness</u> prevailed.

Enoch (<u>and Elisha the Prophet</u>) are the only two men that have <u>never died</u>. Both were taken to heaven for a special purpose found in <u>Revelation 11:3</u>.*

Enoch <u>preached</u> to the world of men before his departure, saying, "...Behold, the Lord cometh with ten thousands of his <u>saints</u>, to execute <u>judgment</u> upon <u>all</u>, and to <u>convince</u> <u>all</u> that are ungodly among them of <u>all</u> their ungodly deeds which they have ungodly committed, and of <u>all</u> their hard speeches which ungodly sinners have spoken against him" (Jude 1:14-15).

Enoch's <u>warning</u> was heard by all the generations, but it fell on deaf ears by those who were content to <u>walk in unbelief</u>. According to <u>Genesis 5:30</u>, Noah had brothers and sisters, but <u>none of them</u> went with him on the Ark.

Noah's wife was with her husband, but there is no mention of <u>her</u> family believing the message that Noah preached. Noah's three daughter-in-laws entered with Noah, but their families **did not**.

Noah preached for <u>120 years</u> before "<u>the Lord shut</u> <u>him in</u>" (GENESIS 7:16) the Ark. Undoubtedly, everyone in

the Ark witnessed that <u>final</u> moment of closing from the rest of the world. It must had been a moment of sadness to everyone in the Ark, leaving family, relatives and friends <u>behind</u> in their unbelief.

"By <u>FAITH</u> Noah, being <u>WARNED</u> of God of things <u>not seen as yet, moved with fear</u>, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by <u>FAITH</u>" (HEBREWS 11:7).



Noah and his family sat in the Ark for <u>seven</u> days before the flood (GENESIS 7:10), but when the rains came, they must have been thinking of their families, their friends and their neighbors <u>outside</u> the Ark.

Were <u>their</u> family members <u>beating</u> on that Ark after the rains started? Were <u>their</u> friends and neighbors out there too? We do not know. But today, believers <u>suffer</u> the same burden for their love ones too, because of their <u>rejection</u> of the Word of God.

Yet, Jesus did say that a prophet is <u>without</u> honor in his <u>own</u> country, among his <u>own</u> kin, and they of his <u>own</u> household (MARK 6:4), the <u>very people</u> closest to believers. What a <u>tremendous</u> burden to bear.

But, "knowing therefore the <u>TERROR</u> of the Lord, we <u>persuade</u> men" (2 COR. 5:11), as God brings forth the "<u>increase</u>" through the "<u>hearing</u>" of His Word, including our families and friends.

Nevertheless, God will "... wipe away all tears from [our] eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away" (Rev. 21:4). Amen, and Amen.

*Some believe that Moses, instead of Enoch, is with Elisha as the second witness (Matt. 17:3), but, "comparing spiritual things with spiritual" (1 Cor. 2:13), we know that it is appointed unto all men once to die (Heb. 9:27) and that "flesh and blood CANNOT inherit the kingdom of God (1 Cor. 15:50).
