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The Mission of La Escuelita San Marcos is to prepare Spanish-speaking children from low-income families to thrive in education systems, develop necessary social skills, and nurture life skills so they are successful in school and beyond.

La Escuelita supports students' families with parenting and life skills workshops, empowers them to take leadership roles in the school community, and enables them to sustain and nurture their children's education and social development.

La Escuelita was founded on the campus of St. Mark's Church in 2013 with just one class combining 3 and 4 year old children. In 2014, a second class was added and in 2015 Hopewell Presbyterian Church joined in the Ministry. La Escuelita was moved to the Hopewell Education building at that point.

In 2016 La Escuelita joined with Caterpillar Ministries to serve the Hispanic children of the Huntington Green area. Working together with Caterpillar, the decision was made to disband their own once a week preschool program and instead provide van transportation and tuition support for 10 students per year to attend La Escuelita.

In January of 2018, at the request of parents, a 2 year old class was added for children who would benefit from the extra year in order to thrive. The class follows the same curriculum themes as the other classes, with age appropriate modifications, and the students take the first guided steps toward literacy, numeracy, and socialization in a smaller, 3 day per week setting.

The mission has evolved and developed over the years to better serve the needs of the families. In 2018 La Escuelita moved to a co-operative model, helping parents to take a more active role and develop leadership skills within the community. Parents serve as "Mamas Maestras" – "Teacher Moms" twice a month in the classroom. Moms, Dads, or even grandmothers work with the teacher, helping the students with projects, lunchtime, and socializing, as well as helping keep the space clean and safe. Parents began their own fundraiser this year, the Super Bowl Snack Sale. Offering their delicious native foods to Hopewell and St. Mark's parishioners, they raised over \$2000! They are hoping to make this an annual event.

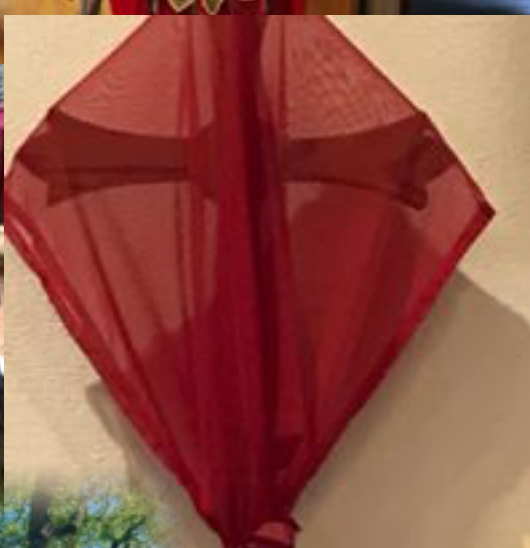


Another key component to the program is the help of English speaking volunteers from St Marks and Hopewell. Some serve as readers, coming once a week, or on a rotating basis. Others adopt a class and come weekly to read, help with projects, and chat in English with their class. The volunteers are important for the children to adapt to a number of accents and pronunciations, all within the range of native speakers of English. Together with donations of school materials, financial support, and prayers for this Ministry, the community of St. Mark's has built this into a thriving resource for Latino neighbors, one on which they can depend for loving help for their children and themselves. **Join us on May 26th at 11am for Preschool Sunday and Graduation.**

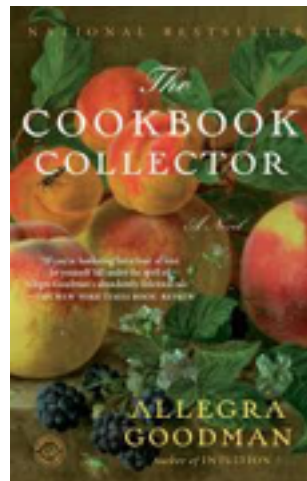
