Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This month I would like to begin this article with a short but deeply insightful poem. The poem is titled I MISSED HIM...FOUND HIM. It was composed by the long deceased Scottish author, poet, and Christian minister George MacDonald. Let me share it with you now;



I missed Him when the sun began to bend; I found Him not when I had lost his rim: With many tears I went in search of Him; Climbing high mountains which did still ascend, And gave me echoes when I called my friend; Through cities vast and charnel-houses grim, And high cathedrals where the light was dim. Through books and arts and works without an end, But found Him not – the friend whom I had lost. And yet I found Him – as I found the lark, A sound in fields I heard but could not mark: I found Him nearest when I missed Him most: I found Him in my heart, a life in frost, A light I knew not till my soul was dark.

This poem is a wonderful work that provides us with an insightful look into how people many times want to call on God at their own whim all the while missing God's presence in the place God lives. Within its message is our assurance of God's presence in our life if we know where to look. And for this - we can give thanks.

Our lives many times seem similar to the imagery this poem conjures up. There are times we feel as if we are constantly climbing up a high mountain that appears to continually ascend into the clouds without end. As we work on ascending this mountain it continues upward and when the climb becomes too much we may stop to yell out for Jesus - only to hear our voice echo back to us. We look for Jesus in our cities and towns and wonder if somehow we have been abandoned. There are times we come to church only to find the experience we wanted to have with God was not what we expected. And so we begin to doubt and turn to others forms of help that promise relief; books, entertainment and "works end."

This is not unique to us, for this poem was written over 100 years ago. So as much as our world has changed over the course of the past century; people of faith are still struggling with the same question when it comes to our spiritual life, and that is - where is Jesus? Jesus of course is found in our heart! With all the things we deal with throughout our lives the one thing that is constant and without question is Jesus is right where He has been since our baptism into Christ. As we surrender our self, our inner being, to the love of God we find Jesus when we need Him most. We are not abandoned or alone, we do not have to look far and wide, we have Jesus with us and all we have to do is surrender the things that distract us from our true reason for being. And for that we can be ever thankful during this season of thanksgiving. Happy Thanksgiving everyone.




