September (at least in our area) marks the start of the school year for most of our school age children. Many children are excited to get back to school and reestablish friendships with their schoolmates from last year. Older students might be excited about a specific class or starting in a new (to them) building. Parent might be even be relieved that the summer is over and they entrust their children to the schools. Students enter the new school year often with many new school supplies and clothes. They enter the doors in various states of readiness to learn whatever academic lessons are set before them over the next several months.

As much value as an academic education is, it is far more important to have a solid spiritual education. An academic education can prepare us for an occupation that may last 30, 40, 50 maybe even 60 years. A spiritual education is one that not only will endure this lifetime, but for eternity. It is an education that we must pass down to future generations, be it children, grandchildren


or even great-grandchildren. Moses wrote of teaching our children God's ways as we go about our daily lives (Deuteronomy 31:19). We are given examples like Ezra who had a heart to study the Law of God (Ezra 7:10). The Psalmist wrote of desiring to be taught by God (Psalm 143:10, 86:11 and many other passages). The apostle Paul admonished Timothy to diligently study the Scriptures (2 Timothy 2:15).

We need to be diligent in our spiritual education, not so we can refute the scoffers, but so we are not let astray by false doctrine (Ephesians 4:14, 1 Timothy 4:16 and other passages). There are many who are out to mislead us with false teaching. Often disguised with elements of truth, but in the end it will lead to destruction. The best way to recognize ithem s by being familiar with the truth. The better we know the truth, the easier it is to recognize a lie.

As our children head back to school, let us also head back to God's Book. Spend time with your children and grandchildren teaching them the truths of scripture.




# Are you included?

### **Pat Answers**

# What did the Evangelical Free Church Vote on in June?

The Evangelical Free Church of America gathers for a nation-wide meeting every two years. This year that meeting was in June at a Chicago Suburban Free Church. Colleen and I were there as delegates from CCEFC. The main item on the Business Agenda for the delegates of the churches to vote on was "Should we remove the word 'Premillennial' from our Doctrinal Statement about the Return of Jesus Christ and replace it with the word 'Glorious'?

Just FYI: The word "premillennial' means we believe Jesus Christ returns before He sets up a literal 1000 year (millennium) reign on the earth from Jerusalem. A key passage is Revelation 20:1-10, which mentions Satan being bound for a 1000 years, etc. This passage along with many Old Testament promises of earthly blessings and the lion laying down with lamb, etc. are part of the support for a premillennial return of Christ. However, many Christians (like those from a Presbyterian or Reformed background) do not believe in this 1000-year literal earthly kingdom to come and are called "Amillennial" (no millennium). The doctrinal change would open up service in our denomination and in our missions programs to those who don't hold to the premillennial view.

The Evangelical Free Church leadership was recommending this change because the Free Church does not desire to divide on "non-essential" doctrines, for example baptism. Free Church leaders explained it was not because of a "slippery slope" and that we as a denomination remain fully committed to the absolute truth, inerrancy, and authority of the Bible. We

also remain fully committed to salvation by grace alone through faith alone in Christ. Removing the word "premillennial" was not considered a gospel issue. Every real Christian still believes in the return of Jesus Christ.

The Free Church allowed vigorous discussion and debate, beginning the day before the vote in a Question and Answer session. Then the day of the vote, the discussion went on for three hours before the vote. Many spoke against the change. Then the vote was taken and it was 77% in favor of dropping the word "premillennial", so that the official Free Church doctrinal statement now reads "We believe in the personal bodily and glorious coming of our Lord Jesus Christ…" A two-thirds majority was needed, but I was surprised at the very large majority in favor.

What does this mean for us here at CCEFC? Because we came in under the original 1950 Evangelical Free Church doctrinal statement, we do not have to change our doctrinal statement here (and our elders don't want to!). We can still preach, teach, and believe in the premillennial return of Jesus Christ. Nothing changes at CCEFC. But the Evangelical Free Church nationally will now ordain pastors, send missionaries, and hire professors who may not be premillennial in their views of Christ's return. New churches joining with us and all national leaders will have to agree with the new doctrinal statement.

If you have further questions, please see me. May all of us live in light of Christ's coming "renouncing ungodliness and worldly passions... waiting for our blessed hope, the glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ." – Titus 2:13.
