June 1, 2020

- Governor Cuomo held a press conference at 11:30 AM and announced the following:
  - <u>Total hospitalizations at 3,121 on June 1</u>.
  - $\circ$  Total deaths increased by 58 on June 1.
  - Reopening:
    - Western New York moves into Phase Two today.
    - Capital Region is on track to enter Phase Two Wednesday.
    - New York City is on track to enter Phase One on June 8.
    - Summer day camps can open on June 29.
      - No decision yet on sleep-away camps.

## **State News Updates**

June 1, 2020

- Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order 202.36. Highlights include:
  - Allowing electronic questionnaires to be sufficient for establishing a practitioner-patient relationship for purposes of ordering a clinical laboratory test.
  - Allowing for the opening of barbershops and hair salons in Phase Two.
  - Permitting any region that has met the metrics for Phase One opening to allow outdoor, low-risk recreational activities.
    - Businesses providing such activities, as determined by Empire State Development Corporation, will also be permitted to operate (in accordance with Department of Health guidance).
  - Extending provisions in Executive Order 202.32 allowing any licensee or franchise of a racetrack to operate such racetrack until July 2, 2020, and allowing any operator of an auto racetrack to operate beginning June 3, 2020 without visitors or spectators.
  - Extending by 21 days, the period for paying property taxes without interest or penalty, in certain localities that have requested such an extension.
