Your Chance To Give

We have all heard about the devastating fires burning in California, but I never thought about it from a quilter's view point. The Camp Fire in Northern California destroyed most of the town of Paradise. Isobel shared a blog with me from a quilter that she regularly follows. It was about Tina, a member of a quilt guild near Paradise, that is involved in making charity quilts. Tina said she lost her home, all her charity quilts, those finished and in progress, her long arm and sewing machines, library of sewing books and all her possessions. She described the mental anguish and sadness that she and others are experiencing. The second thing she mentioned she lost, after her home, were her charity quilts. Tina is living in a hotel, along with a lot of other fire evacuees. Even with all she has to do to find a place to live and replace life's necessities, she longs to

be able do her charity work. She has asked for quilters to send her finished quilts and she will get them to families in need. Tina mentioned that 98 members of her quilt guild lost their homes, too, but are thankful to be alive. So if you have any finished quilts of any size you are willing to give to Tina, she will distribute them to comfort fire victims in California. You can contact me or Isobel, if you want Tina's address, or you can You can bring finished quilts to the December chapter meetings and we will try to get them to California.

Small Service Projects

In October we had seven baby quilts, four bereavement quilts, 121 fabric hearts, and 18 pillowcases turned in. At the November meetings we had 18 baby quilts, 92 fabric hearts and 38 pillowcases turned in. Deliveries will be made soon to Riverside Hospital and CHKD of baby quilts and hearts, as well as pillowcases to MCV in Richmond. We also handed out kits for nine pillowcases to members at the Night Chapter meeting. Thank you to the many members who continue to support these projects. We often hear of how our efforts touch the lives of those in need. Please be thinking of any small service projects you would like to bring to the guild to vote on for next year.

Meanwhile, small baby quilts for families are in need at Riverside Hospital and comfort quilts for babies in CHKD NICU palliative care.

- A good size for these quilts is approximately 30" x 36".
- Fabric hearts for Mothers with babies in NICU at Riverside and CHKD.
- Full-size pillowcases made with bright, happy novelty fabric for children with cancer at MCV in Richmond. They should be made with 100% cotton fabric. Don't use fabric with glitter or flannel. Finished pillowcases will be taken to the Blue Crab Quilt, Co., in Richmond for distribution at MCV Hospital. They are rewashed and pressed by the hospital liaison so no need to wash and press.
