WHO IS ... "CHARLIER"?

If you have been studying magic for a fair length of time, you have probably picked up some pretty good "moves" with cards, coins, and even rope. You might even have a few good tricks using a borrowed iPhone. But lets focus on one of the inexpensive tools of magic. A deck of playing cards. There are so many things one can do with some playing cards. Fifty-two cards, not counting the two jokers. Besides some of the classics of card magic, such as the various types of 'color changes', "The Lie Detector", and Vernon's "Travelers", and "Triumph", there are those fancy flourishes and those that involves cutting the cards with one hand. A one-handed cut, that is sometimes called a 'control', is done by just about everyone who has been doing card magic for guite a while. It is performed in a nonchalant way and often is performed mostly to show the onlooker how skillful the magician is. There's nothing wrong with impressing an audience, as long as you can follow up with an even more impressive payoff. The one-handed pass; what is the history of that elusive, often done move? Not to mention, who came up with that. Yes, that question might be a bit trivial, and do we even care who created it, as long as we now have it to perform? Maybe it's just me, but I like to know where things come from. I have heard of Charlier, but with this "man of mystery", it's the tiny details that are the most interesting.

Some call this one-handed control, the Charlier Pass. Yes, that's great, but who is "Charlier"? Is that his first name or last name? Or, is that his only name ... like Cher, Bono, Madonna, or Sting?

MYSTERY GRAB BAG MAGIC

.... and MENTALISM !

Sketch of Charlier (circa 1880)


"Charlier: There WAS a "man of mystery." A strange character who was credited with extraordinary ability manipulating cards: whose very personality defied interpretation; whose life was a riddle. What is written of him here – and much more – has been written below, yet it is my opinion that as a class, magicians, and magical enthusiasts are unacquainted with the story of this human enigma.

Charles Bertram's, "Isn't It Wonderful" references to Charlier in works by Angelo Lewis (Prof. Hoffman), and Henry Ridgely Evans' "History of Conjuring and Magic." Have in the man, been the sources from which the Information herewith was obtained. To the sources named, due acknowledgment.

Charlier, who probably was the inventor of the onehanded pass, which we know as the "Charlier Pass", was master of a marking system which enabled him to perform seeming miracles with cards. This, coupled with masterly manipulative skill, made him a conjurer very much out of the ordinary, if we take the reliable opinions of Lewis and Bertram.

Not only was he a conjuror, but a monogram designer. He first became known to Lewis, in London, in 1874. Lewis described Charlier's condition as that of "chronic poverty". His nationality was in question, some insisting

he was a Frenchman. Others called him an Italian, some a Greek. Others said he was "The Wandering Jew." No one seemed to know his age. Certainly he was an old man when Lewis and Bertram met him, for his face was 'wrinkled like that of a mummy and his shoulders were bent with years'. Bertram described him as "having a thin, clean shaven face; long, long, gray straggly hair; small piercing eyes, and a firmly closed mouth, and a 'Jewish' type of nose."



A strange garb he wore, comprising a high silk hat; old looking clothes which were too large for him, except the trousers where were baggy and too short; a clean but cuffless shirt and white stockings. Bertram tells of Charlier's greeting, "I'll denounce you before the cardinal", or "I give you my blessing." Charlier did other unusual things, refusing for one thing, to take pay for performing tricks for Bertram, although from all appearances he was in need.

Bertram relates how an old friend and also a friend of Charlier's reported the conjuror's death and burial. Later Bertram heard that Charlier had been seen alive and had announced he was going to Naples to be married. Henry Ridgely Evans, in his book, reports about a conjuror, calling himself St. Jean, who mysteriously appeared in California in 1877. The man answered the description of Charlier.

Certain it is that Charlier was a real "man of mystery" and a wonderful performer of card tricks. Other forms of magic were out of his line."

Our art form is full of mystery. There is always something new to learn. It's there .. hidden away and begging to be revealed! \clubsuit


