Mark 15:1-47; Luke 23:33-49

It seemed absolutely impossible that anything dreadful could happen after such a glad day.

But it did.

It all began with some people who did not believe that Jesus is the Son of God. It would have been quite dreadful enough if they just didn't believe it and let it go at that. But they didn't stop there. They sent a band of soldiers after Jesus. And the soldiers caught Him in a garden where He was praying to God. And they arrested Him and dragged Him before the ruler. ing day when Jesus road into Jerusalem!

The people who didn't believe in Jesus made a big wooden cross. They dragged Jesus into the street. They made Him carry the cross through the city. They took Him to a hill just outside the city. And there, on that hill, they nailed Him by His hands and His feet to the cross. And they put the cross in a hole in the ground, so it stood up straight and tall. And there they left Him to die.

It seemed incredible! Jesus was dead! It was just so hard to believe! JESUS was dead!

It was all over. All the gladness was over.

His friends took Him down from the cross. They carried Him—oh so tenderly—to a garden tomb. And there they wrapped Him in soft clean cloths. And there they left Him.

The soldiers rolled a HUGE stone over the door of the tomb. And Jesus' friends felt that there was no more gladness, anywhere in the world, anymore.

It was the saddest day in the world. But little did they know that there was a GLAD day coming! And it was just around the corner! The GLADDEST day in the world was coming!

Romans 10:13 for, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."
