Information was shared with the group about the petition and the results to date – over 1800 signatures on the paper petition and over 600 for on line petition (more than 1220 but we only included those that are directly impacted by the services), still have more signatures arriving after we delivered the petitions. We had involvement from all of the communities in our catchment, including all 6 first nations, it truly represents the catchment area of our Hospital. A motion was passed approving escalating activities if we don't get a response from the petitions. This might include things like rallies, demonstrations, community interest meetings.

We delivered the petition to Jackie Tegart MLA, Fraser Nicola at her constituency office here in Ashcroft. It was well received and she offered her assistance where possible to facilitate meetings and some guidance. The others were sent by Registered Mail, we know they are delivered, but still waiting . . .

The new executive did an interview for / with Gareth Smart of the *Hub Online Network*, it is about the work of this group and an emphasis on the decline of Emergency Services, it should be posted Tuesday he tells me.
