


## A Few Words from the President

Bert Allerton (Albert Allen Gustafson) entered the world on New Year's Day, January 1, 1889. He worked as a successful close-up magician in top nightclubs and hotels across the United States. Allerton also created several playing card routines that are in full use today.

After a career as an oil salesman and the death of his wife, Allerton took up magic. He eventually started performing close-up magic in nightclubs. He worked for many years at the Ambassador East Hotel Pump Room in Chicago as well as the House

of Murphy in Hollywood and the Hotel Pierre in New York City.

Allerton was one of the few magicians at the time to work exclusively in the close-up arena. One of his features was performing the Vanishing Bird Cage close up. His effects and routines appeared in many publications, including, "The Bert Allerton Aspirin Tin Routine" (found in "The Performance of Close-Up", by Eugene Burger, 1983). He also appeared in Series 3 of the Stars of Magic was published in 1947, and was devoted to Allerton. One of his card routines that is still performed to this day is "Pump Room Phantasy". This is a trick worth looking into, as there is a lot of comedy potential found in this one. He also authored an important magic book titled, "The Close-Up Magician". Bert Allerton passed away in 1958, and his final resting place is at Memorial Park Cemetery, 9900 Gross Point Road, Skokie, IL
