concentrate on the communication-arts-portion of the Stanford tests, but we will be getting back into our regular reading series this week. My plan is to start the ball rolling on our Patriot's Pen essays this week as well. In math, 6th grade is working on rounding and estimation, integers, and the nature of fractions. Seventh grade is using equations to figure part/whole problems, looking at similar and congruent polygons, and geometric concepts of complex figures. Eighth grade is looking at strategies for unit multipliers and metric and customary units.
