


Dear Parents



Literacy Activity - After reading the sensory story make some play dough bread (flour and water) for the little red hen. Download Twinkl's little red hen play dough mats or download pic below.




Numeracy activities. Sorting and matching colours




Items you will need for our science activity are:

Eggs


Plate



Art - Complete the hatching chick craft by following the visual instructions below.





Scarf activities - Continuing on from last week continue with some scarf activities with your child to build motor skills. Explore these games with your child...

- Skywriting can you mark make the first letter of your name? What other marks can you make?
- Let's go fishing! hold scarf in both hands and pretend it's a fishing rod. Lift up the scarf saying 'Here, fishy, fishy! ' and lift up the scarf slowly through the hands to see what you have 'caught'! (Use your imagination to pretend there are lots of funny things at the bottom of the scarf or even tie little toys etc to the bottom for your child to discover)
