Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I would guess that many of us, if we don't particularly care for the winter months, become a little anxious when March rolls around. If we are fans of the sport of baseball the players have begun reporting to their teams' respective training camps which means the baseball season will begin shortly. If we are gardeners who plant from seed, we can prepare the starter trays for all of the vegetables or flowers we will plant in the weeks and months to come. MISSION MINDERS-MARCH, 2018

Our first mission project for 2018 will be the **Bo Tkach Foundation**. Bo Tkach was an outstanding high school athlete from the Northern Lehigh School district, who went on to graduate Magna Cum Laude from Wilkes University. Bo's parents, Jim and Sandy, grew up in Lehigh, and Jim was a teacher, principal, and coach for several area high schools.

Bo suffered from Obsessive/Compulsive Disorder, which often led to prolonged bouts of severe depression. In 2007, Bo committed suicide. His parents have formed a foundation in his memory that speaks to the spirit and life of their son. Each year with the donations that it receives, the Bo Tkach Foundation does the following: 1. Sponsors **youth athletic programs** throughout Carbon, Lehigh, and Northampton counties. 2. Provides **scholarships** to students in Palmerton, Lehigh, and Northern Lehigh School Districts. 3. Gives **financial assistance** to students who would not have access to mental health screening and treatment. 4. Presents **talks/workshops** to school and youth groups, educators, and health personnel that discuss facts about Obsessive/Compulsive Behavior and Depression, and resources available for these conditions.

Depression and suicide affect thousands of people each year. We at Ben Salem have not been immune to the loss and pain inflicted on families and friends who have had to suffer and endure its consequences. We ask that you support the Bo Tkach Foundation mission project, which will run through the end of May. Please mark your mission envelopes with "**BO**" to designate your donation.

Please also note upcoming opportunities to volunteer:

The **Food Bank** is in need of volunteers to help with distributing food to needy families in our congregation and local area. It distributes 6-8 times per year on a Saturday morning, and takes only a ½ hour of your time to help on that day. 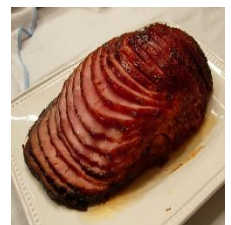
