RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Ones,

As I sit and reflect upon this time of year I smile. I really like this time of year despite the hectic pace that has become a part of it for so many. I like the lights, the singing, the Christmas movies, the festive mood and the sharing of gifts on Christmas day, though I enjoyed the latter far more before the boys grew up and left home. Now I'm waiting for a Christmas day with the grandkids.

I also like the way people treat others a little more kindly at this time of year.

There really is something genuine to this whole idea of Christmas cheer. As Dec. 25th draws near, people warm up just a bit. You'll notice that people are friendlier at this time of the year. Folks warm up when they are mindful of the Christ child's birth, and make an extra effort to practice the virtues of which the angels sing — "peace on earth, goodwill towards men."

But consider this – why do we notice this at Christmas? Why does this surge in warm heartedness stand out? I think it's because, despite our best intentions, good will towards men and women can easily become a seasonal event rather than a standing policy.

When Christ entered our world, He didn't come to brighten our Decembers, but to transform our lives. It can be hard work to practice good will towards one another. But John the Baptist's message was that as we prepare for Christ to come into our lives, we change our ways.

The Gospel accounts of Jesus' ministry provide the blueprint for loving our neighbor in a busy and complicated neighborhood. Christ made a point of seeking out the broken and disenfranchised people of his day – the lepers, prostitutes and tax collectors – and He saw the value in each one of them. And in so doing, He helped them recognize the value in themselves. He was the light in their dark world.

I read a story about a little girl who understood this and helped her father see it too. It is both cute and profound. He tells the story as follows:

The day of the Christmas presentation finally arrived. My young daughter, Jana, was so excited about her part that I knew she had to be one of the main characters, though she had not told me what she was to do. The parents were all there and one by one the children took their places. I could see the shepherds fidgeting in the corner of the stage meant to represent the fields for the sheep. Mary and Joseph stood solemnly behind the manger. In the back three young wise men waited impatiently. And there sat Jana, quietly and confidently.

Then the teacher began: "A long time ago, Mary and Joseph had a baby and they named Him Jesus," she said. "And when Jesus was born, a bright star appeared over the stable."

At that cue, Jana got up from her chair, picked up a large aluminum-foil star, walked behind Mary and Joseph and held the star up high for everyone to see.

When the teacher told about the shepherds coming to see the baby, the three young shepherds came forward and Jana jiggled the star up and down excitedly to show them where to come. When the wise men responded to their cue, she went forward a little to meet them and to lead the way, her face as bright as the real star might have been.

The little play ended and then we had refreshments. On the way home Jana said, with great satisfaction, "I had the main part!"

"You did?" I questioned, wondering why she thought that.

"Yes," she said, "'cause I showed everybody how to find Jesus!"

How true! To show others how to find Jesus, to be the light for their paths, that is <u>the</u> finest role we can play in life. This Christmas season, let us recognize that just as faith is a decision, good will towards people is a series of decisions that work themselves out, not in temporary holiday cheer, but in the details of everyday life. Let us be a star, a light in the lives of others that points the way to Jesus. You see, Christmas is a day and also a season – but the gift which Christmas brings is Jesus Christ who is present with us each day of the year and who brings eternal life forever.

Income for the month of October was \$10,378.50 (budget \$9,350.17). Expenditures totaled \$10,881.79 (budget \$9,350.17), resulting in a deficit for the month of \$503.29. There were no obligations due and unpaid at the end of October Contributions to and interest earned on our Raise the Roof Fund during the month of October totaled \$157.58. Total raised as of October 31 - \$96,604.69. (September's report erroneously

showed total raised as \$97,447.11 – actual figure as of 9/30 was \$96,447.11) The book value of our endowment fund as of September 30 was \$54,620.44.

Please continue to pray for Grace Church that it will grow spiritually, financially and numerically. If you have any questions about this report or any financial matter, please contact me.

Senior Warden's Vestry Report

<u>Buildings & Grounds</u>: A light was rewired in the Sanctuary. The Parish Hall air conditioning (A/C) was checked and found to have a bad surge protector; this has been replaced. The microwave in the Parish Hall stopped working and has since been replaced with a new one. <u>Roof</u>: Unfortunately, the grant Letter of Inquiry (LOI) to Oldham Little Church Foundation (OLCF) that was pending a decision has since been denied. However, OLCF stated that the decision in no way indicated a negative assessment of our church or proposal and that the denial merely spoke to the overwhelming need across the nation.

At the last roof meeting, the engineering contract was signed, so that the job could move forward; however, at the time of the Vestry meeting, the engineering report (from Falcon Company) had not yet been received. It was decided that the roof committee would make a final decision and make a recommendation to the Vestry at which time a special Vestry meeting would be called to sign a contract. It was recommended that the roof be Buckingham black slate with aluminum gutters. It was reported that the approximate period of performance would be three weeks. The roof committee named Bryan Jacobs as the roof project manager, giving him permission to sign a contract and to make decisions on changes that may occur; the Vestry agreed. It was decided that services would be held at the Parish Hall, while the work is being done.

<u>St Luke's Rector Sharing project</u>: St Luke's Vestry decided that it would like to extend the invitation to Jim to continue serving their church. A sharing arrangement was agreed upon and a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signed by both churches. The arrangement should provide some improvement to each church's financial health.

Events:

- Thanksgiving Service will not be held at Grace this year. There will be a community service with St. Luke's and other churches in Remington.
- ♣ Grace's Christmas Eve services will be held at the usual times of 5 and 10 pm.

The Vestry dinner will be held at the Cirillo's on December 6.

Other Items:

- Toys that are in the basement of the Family Center need to find a home. It was decided that they be donated to Noah's Ark. Thanks to Jim and Dale for volunteering to take care of this!
- In the past, Grace and several other churches have donated money to give turkeys to the police staff. A motion was carried to donate \$200 to the project again this year.
- [⊕] Culpeper Region meeting was attended by Bryan and Jim. Churches in Culpeper region include Christ, Emmanuel, Little Fork, Piedmont/Bromfield, St. Luke's, St. Stephen's, another St. Stephen's, Trinity, St. James, and Grace Casanova.
- The Diocese has requested pictures of baptismal fonts.
- At the end of this calendar year, Stacey, Bryan and Mary will be departing the Vestry.

- Home Depot Card: The church received an invitation to obtain a Home Depot Credit Card, with the advantages being, tax exempt status and the convenience of having purchases recorded and not having to request reimbursements and checks. A motion to accept this invitation was made and carried at the previous meeting; however, after once the application was submitted, it was denied.

Update from the Roof Committee-November 2019

The total funds raised for the roof project are now at \$97,500! Praise God! The Engineering Firm (Falcon) submitted its report and there were a few obvious repairs needed in the bell tower rafters. Others may be uncovered as the work progresses. As a result of the Engineering Report, the Roof Committee made its recommendations to the Vestry and the Vestry carried a motion to accept the recommendations of the Roof Committee. A contract was let with Thank You Lord (TYL) Restoration and Construction out of Ruther Glen, Virginia. The work will include repairs to the rafters, ridge vents, slate, soffit vents, slate, gutters, and insulation. The color of the slate will be the current color coming out of the quarry now, which is black and may be as thick as one inch. Gutters and ridge vents will be the closest color-match available. TYL will take care of all debris, including the old slate, and has agreed to set aside a portion of it for any of our parishioners to take, should it be desired. Some of the bushes and trees may need to be trimmed or removed in order to ensure clear access. Two sections of fence will be removed for the purpose of gaining clear access from the drive to the roof. The inside of the church will be covered in plastic. Much equipment and a dumpster will be placed in the church parking area, but a thoroughfare to the Family Center and Rectory will remain open.

Bryan Jacobs was voted to be the Project Manager, with permission to sign contractual documents, including all change orders up to \$2,500.00.

As the Roof Committee has now completed its task, future decisions and tasks beyond that of the Project Manager, will be left to the Vestry. Again, thank you to all who have donated, worked to raise funds, offered suggestions, provided opinions, and performed research. Mostly, thank you for your patience and prayers.
