- On February 6th, RNAO Windsor-Essex Chapter met with MPP Taras Natyshak as part of Queen's Park on the Road. The meeting was very fruitful and was centered around main advocacy points outlined in the RNAO's platform.
- On February 22nd, Chapter members met with MPP Teresa Piruzza as part of Queen's Park on the Road. Similar topics were discussed.
- On March 13th, RNAO Windsor-Essex Chapter arranged to host MPP Taras Natyshak for a full day of touring as part of "Take Your MPP to Work Day". Taras was welcomed for tours and discussions with local nurses at Windsor Regional Hospital, Hotel Dieu Grace Hospital, the Windsor-Essex County Health Unit and the Windsor Essex Community Health Centre. A nursing luncheon was also arranged to provide Taras with the opportunity to speak to nurses working in the field. The whole day was a successful showcase of the nursing profession across different sectors and informed MPP Natyshak about local challenges facing our healthcare system. A media advisory was sent out prior to the event and there was great interest from local media outlets leading up to the day and on the day of the event.

END: RNAO speaks out on emerging issues that impact on nurses and the nursing profession, health and health care.

On March 4th, local chapter members joined over 200 citizens in participating in the "Save our Services" rally as part of the Ontario Day of Action for Health Care called by the Ontario Health Coalition. Chapter President Jennifer Johnston was asked to speak at the microphone on behalf of nurses. Interviews were also given to local radio stations. This was a very powerful event that brought to light the detrimental effects of budget cuts affecting our provincial healthcare system. This rally was in response to the Liberal government reneging on commitments to fund 48 healthcare beds needed for our community. Since the rally, the government has made amends and is working with local hospitals to fund the beds promised!
