RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS FAREWELL: MY FINAL REFLECTION

Dear Ones,

Each time I read or even hear the following words, I can't help but hear the twanging guitar of Roger McGuinn and the Byrds. Maybe you do too.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

- a time to be born, and a time to die;
- a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted;
- a time to kill, and a time to heal;
- a time to break down, and a time to build up;
- a time to weep, and a time to laugh;
- a time to mourn, and a time to dance;
- a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together;
- a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;
- a time to seek, and a time to lose;
- a time to keep, and a time to throw away;
- a time to tear, and a time to sew;
- a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;
- a time to love, and a time to hate;
- a time for war, and a time for peace. Ecclesiastes 3:1-8

Now, it is for me (and Dale), time for a new season in our lives: a time to retire. By default, it will also be a new season for Grace Church as you seek and search who will be the next priest at Grace. May God bless you all as you work and pray to discover the person of God's own choosing to next serve you in Christ.

What began as a very temporary "arrangement" has turned into a long and loving relationship, that though dramatically changed, will never end, at least in Dale's and my heart's. As I have said many times at annual meetings, who would have thought that a 3-month gig would have turned

into a 16 ½ year relationship? Now, as I/we retire, that relationship does not end, but changes dramatically, as it must for the sake of the next pastor at Grace.

In looking at this leave taking between us, I think it is important to note that the end of the relationship with the previous rector was under an uncomfortable strain due to reasons beyond the rector's control. No one was at fault, but the ending and separation was difficult and awkward. I left a parish also under difficult and painful circumstances where I had served faithfully but was very hurt, to say the least, by our separation and end of pastoral relationship.

I am pleased to have this pastoral separation end on good terms on both sides so as to set a good tone for whomever follows as the new priest. Nevertheless, such an end is still difficult and we all will grieve, which is a sign of a significant and caring relationship. As you can easily imagine, tears are flowing as I type.

What truly saddens me at this point, is the way we have had to end this time together. And by that, I mean that we have had to end our time together – apart! None of us could have imagined that March 8, the Second Sunday of Lent, would have been my last service here with you. Who could have imagined missing Palm Sunday and Easter and even Pentecost together? But we have, and we cannot change it and life will go on, or as many say these days, "It is what it is!" That said, I cannot express how grateful I am for our time together over these many years. I never dreamed that I would serve in one place so long since the average "stay" of a rector now in the Episcopal Church is around 7 years, the length of my last position.

I am not perfect, as you know by now, and I know that I have missed opportunities to minister to you at times, which I regret. I also know that I have been there at times when many clergy I know would not have been and for that, again, I am grateful.

In our time together, I have buried too many, baptized and married too few and walked with you through both heartbreaks and joys. Together, we weathered several years of severe financial strain in 2009 to 2011. Together we celebrated the 150th anniversary of Grace Church! In that 150 years, I have served as the pastor at Grace longer than anyone else, which makes me happy. Together, we put on a new roof! Together, we have lived as a caring community of Christian believers. Above all of this and though it all, I have loved you and you have loved me, and such love is always a gift! It is the "greatest" to which Paul refers in 1 Corinthians 13.

I could go on and on, but I am not a fan of long goodbyes, so I will end with the Blessing of Aaron from Number 6:24-26:

"The Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make His face to shine upon you and be gracious unto you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace."

Treasurer's Report – March 2020

Income for the month of March was \$10,932.65 (budget \$10,423.75). Expenditures totaled \$11,097.00 (budget \$10,193.42), resulting a deficit for the month of \$164.35.

There were no obligations due and unpaid at the end of March.

Interest earned on our Raise the Roof Fund during the month of March was \$2.13. There were no expenditures. The balance in the roof fund account at the end of the month was \$14,972.91.

The book value of our endowment fund as of February 29 was \$57,511.98; market value \$ 55,972.71.

During this time when we can no longer worship together, I urge you to please continue with your pledges if possible. You can either mail your check to Grace at PO Box 18, Casanova, VA 20139, or put it in my box at the Parish Hall. We have received waivers and grace periods for health insurance and pension plan payments; with these concessions and your continued giving I believe Grace will be able to meet all its other obligations in a timely manner throughout these troubling times.

Please continue to pray for Grace Church that it will grow spiritually, financially and numerically. If you have any questions about this report or any financial matter, please contact me.
