Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On behalf of the Most Worshipful Grand Master, it gives me immense pleasure to extend to you a most cordial invitation to enroll into the M.W. Walter Gulley Jr. Masonic University of Instruction.

As pioneers in the field of education, our Grand Lodge and Grand Chapter collaborated to develop four innovative degree programs, which include Associate, Bachelor, Master, and Doctorate degrees in masonic education. Each degree program has associated with it a state-of-the-art curriculum, contemporary course topics and objectives, knowledgeable instructors, and three general requirements for those who choose to enroll: (1) Register for and pass masonic courses within the degree program of choice; (2) conduct and present masonic research, and; (3) participate in a prescribed number of service hours with the Knights of Pythagoras or the Starlight's Youth Council. Persons who successfully fulfill the university's requirements for graduation will participate in a graduation ceremony and receive a university medallion and special seating during future Grand Lodge sessions.

Associate degree courses shall begin on Friday, September 16th, at 7PM. Course work will continue on Saturday, September 17th, from 10am until 6pm, and wrap up on Sunday, September 18th, at 1PM. To maximize participant learning, classes will include lecture materials, interactive activities, group exercises and assignments, and a final exam. Moreover, university instructors are responsible collectively for designing and delivering educational modules that ensure participants truly enjoy the process of learning and that promote continuous fraternal engagement. Please find enclosed the curriculum for the Associate of Arts (AA) degree in Masonry.

The cost to register for the Associate degree is \$160 per person. Should you decide to enroll into this unique, educational endeavor, a completed registration form and a check made payable to the **Most Worshipful Union Grand Lodge of Florida Foundation** should be mailed by *Friday, August 13, 2016* to the university registrar, Sister TinaMarie N. Please keep in mind that since the University of Instruction is under the umbrella of the Grand Lodge Foundation, participants may write off the cost of tuition when filing annual tax returns.

Course Synopsis

Joint Courses

PHA 1100: Prince Hall, MWUGL, and Jerusalem Grand Chapter History.

This course delineates the history of Prince Hall masonry, the Most Worshipful Union Grand Lodge of Florida, and Jerusalem Grand Chapter, OES. Course content shall be delivered through lecture and a summative exam shall be administered upon completion.

PHA 1101: Hazing: Ethics, Etiquette, and Evolution.

This course introduces state and federal hazing laws and the importance of adhering to such laws. Masonic ethics and etiquette are deliberately highlighted in this course as a necessity for jurisdictional compliance. Participatory exercises, group presentations, and a summative exam will be facilitated.

PHA 1102: Masonic Protocol.

This course focuses specifically on methods by which masonic protocol should be appropriately employed in various settings. Participatory exercises, group presentations, and a summative exam will be facilitated.

PHA 1103: Introduction to Masonic Symbolism and Esoteric Masonry

Esoteric masonry and symbolism are methods by which the wisdom of the ages has been harnessed for those who have developed effective interpretation techniques. The basics of symbolism and interpretation will be discussed with intent in this course. Participatory exercises and a summative exam will be facilitated.

PHA 1104: Introduction to Principles of Leadership

Principles of effective leadership are fundamental to the success of an organization. This course depicts introductory principles of effective leadership and inculcates such principles through group exercises and presentations. A summative exam shall be administered upon completion.

PHA 1105: Masonic Research I

Profound analysis of esoteric topics and masonic symbols generally leads to positive, internal transformation and mental growth. This course shall cover the fundamentals of general research design and writing skills. Participants shall be expected to complete an uncomplicated research project of personal interest and submit a conclusive, written evaluation. The University's research requirements are requisite for fulfillment of competencies associated with the Associates degree.

PHA 1106: Masonic Service I

Since its inception, service to mankind has been a core value of masonic organizations. This course italicizes the importance of continuous service by requiring participants to volunteer at three meetings of the MWUGL of Florida's Knights of Pythagoras or Jerusalem Grand Chapter's Starlight's Youth Council. Participation in the aforesaid meetings shall be verified by signatures from the Youth Council's supervisor and the Worshipful Master or Worthy Matron of the participant's lodge or chapter, respectively. The University's service requirements are requisite for fulfillment of competencies associated with the Associates degree.

MWUGL Individualized Courses

MGL 1100: Constitution and Bylaws

Comprehension and interpretation of the Constitution and Bylaws of the MWUGL of Florida is a vital component of effectively governing and participating in a subordinate lodge. This course reviews the Grand Lodge's approved regulations and methods by which a subordinate lodge may appropriately institute bylaws. Participatory exercises, group presentations, and a summative exam will be facilitated.

MGL 1101: Interpretation of Masonic Landmarks

Since its inception, masonic jurisprudence has been guided by 25 non-negotiable landmarks. This course shall review the landmarks and indoctrinate these principles through group exercises. A summative exam will be administered upon completion.

OES Individualized Courses

OES 1100: Constitution and Bylaws

Comprehension and interpretation of the Constitution and Bylaws of Jerusalem Grand Chapter, OES, is a vital component of effectively governing and participating in a subordinate chapter. This course reviews the Grand Chapter's approved regulations and methods by which a subordinate chapter may institute bylaws. Participatory exercises, group presentations, and a summative exam will be administered upon completion.

OES 1101: Interpretation of Masonic Landmarks

Masonic jurisprudence for the Order of the Eastern Star is guided by 15 non-negotiable landmarks. This course shall review the landmarks and indoctrinate these principles through group exercises. A summative exam will be administered upon completion.
