Post Building gets a Lighting Upgrade

Oregon Energy Trust Helps with Grant

For the past number of years the florescent lighting ballasts have systematically failed, and the tubes continue to burn out.



With ballasts becoming obsolete, and with some investigation into the viability of upgrading to LED lighting, the executive board

put a bid out to two local electrical contractors. With the Post being used on an average of more than 40 hours a week, and qualifying for a Grant; we're pleased to announce that Better Way Electric will be doing the upgrade to LED lighting in both meeting rooms, the kitchen and the offices.

After an Oregon Energy Trust rebate, the cost of the project will be around \$1,600. The annual savings is estimated to be around \$500. With better and more efficient lighting, there will be a return on the investment in a little over 3 years.


We want to thank Bud and Bob for stepping up to assume their positions for the upcoming year.


We added Dystini Schuster, Junior from RHS to the roster with Sophia Garcia, and McKenzie Vogel.
