Report on the 10th Conference of the Neuropsychological Rehabilitation Special Interest Group of the World Federation for NeuroRehabilitation

The 10th annual conference of the Neuropsychological Rehabilitation Special Interest Group was held from July 8-9th 2013 in Maastricht, The Netherlands. The venue for the two day meeting was the Crowne Plaza Hotel. The conference program showcased 26 oral, 30 datablitz and 77 poster presentations and brought together 181 delegates from 21 countries. One of the many highlights of the conference included the conference dinner held at the beautiful castle Neercanne at the border of Holland and Belgium. The conference was held in a very sunny atmosphere, both inside and outside!

For the opening address, Professor Barbara Wilson (President of the Special Interest Group) gave an excellent presentation on rare and unusual syndromes neuropsychologists may encounter in their daily clinical practice.

The conference program provided a suite of stimulating presentations that depicted some major advances in conceptualisation, outcome assessment, psychometric and statistical analysis, treatment approaches and clinical service provision in neuropsychological rehabilitation.

As a characteristic themes of this conference, the effectiveness of neuropsychological rehabilitation treatment (eg. Tamara Ownsworth), the influence of psychological factors (eg Gisela Wolters-Gregorio) and more specifically depression (eg Marloes van Mierlo), assessment methods and psychometrics (eg Robyn Tate), challenging behaviour (eg Brian O'Neill), caregiver burden (eg Kessiah Hunt), and rehabilitation services (eg Tessa Hart) can be mentioned. Lingani Mbakile gave the audience an impressive outlook on the experience of Traumatic Brain Injury in Botswana; with only two hospitals in the country this makes you realize the abundance of rehabilitation options in western countries, despite the many current financial drawbacks.
