The 2018 Winter Olympics are rapidly coming to a close. Some have been disappointed by the lack of medals by the US compared to several of the past recent Winter Olympics. The athletes work hard to make it to the Olympics. They probably deserve a medal for making it to this prestigious event. What many people don't realize is that the value of the medal is taxable. (Or at least it used to be.) More than one athlete has sold their medal in order to pay the taxes on the medal. Even if the athlete is able to keep the medal their entire life, the medal has no value after they die.

While the ancient Greek Olympics gave a laurel wreath that quickly faded to the winners, and the current Olympics give a gold, silver, or bronze medal to winners, the affect is still the same, the award does not last forever. How many athletes can you name from previous Olympics; there may only be a handful of athletes that you can name, demonstrating how fleeting fame can be.

The apostle Paul talks about running for a temporal award. In 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 talks about how athletes give up things that will keep them from winning. Athletes don't carrying weights when they compete, most watch what they eat, they prepare for the competition, all for a crown that fades. Paul goes on to say that there are things as Christians we need to give up, they are distractions in our life that keep us from running the race God has for us. While athletes compete for a temporary crown and fame, Christians are running for an eternal award often described as crowns.


In "The Evangelical Dictionary of Biblical Theology, W.L. Gerig writes "The "crowns" that are biblically identified as being given on that day include: a crown that will last forever for those who have kept their sinful nature in check (1 Cor. 9:25–27); a crown of righteousness for those who have longed for Christ's appearance (2 Tim. 4:8); a crown of life for those who have endured testing successfully, even to the point of death (James 1:12; Rev. 2:10); a crown of rejoicing for those who have seen souls saved (1 Thess. 2:19); and a crown of glory for those who have faithfully served God's people (1 Peter 5:4). In other places, the rewards are spoken of as "treasures in heaven" (Matt. 6:20), a share in Christ's future role (Rev. 2:26–27), and additional responsibilities and words of praise ("Well done, good and faithful servant"; Matt. 25:21, 23; Luke 19:17, 19). It is worth noting again how intangible and immaterial these rewards are. Even the gift of eternal life is set forth as a prize to be gained. Eternal life is something to be laid hold of by the individual (1 Tim. 6:17–19)."

Paul told the church in Corinth to run so that you can obtain an eternal crown, don't be easily distracted. Run without being disqualified. In what we believe is Paul's final letter that was canonized to Timothy, he wrote "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith" (II Timothy 4:7)

Are you running to obtain a crown? Are you running in to finish the race? Can II Timothy 4:7 be written on your tombstone?

Pat Answers

What Does "Evangelical" Mean?

The word "evangelical" means "of the gospel" and it is a good word to describe what we are supposed to be as a Church and as Christ followers. We are to be about the gospel and unashamed of the gospel – Romans 1:16. The gospel is not just for unbelievers, but for all Christians. We stand on the gospel, we live out the gospel, and we grow in the gospel. We never get over the cross and resurrection of Jesus! – 1 Corinthians 15:3,4. We should preach the gospel to ourselves every day, reminding ourselves we have died to sin with Christ, we have risen with Christ to new life, and we now belong to Him.

The term Evangelical used to mean someone who was not only of the gospel, but also one who fully accepted the full authority of the Bible, and the need for evangelism because Christ is the only way to God – John 14:6. But today the term "Evangelical" may be confusing to some. It is often thought of as a political group or voting bloc. Some still claim to be evangelical Christians, but are changing long-held doctrinal commitments to allow for other ways to God or accepting gay marriage.

Lifeway took a survey in 2017 defining an evan-

gelical as one who agreed with the following statements: 1. The Bible is the highest authority for what I believe. 2. It is very important for me personally to encourage non-Christians to trust Jesus Christ as their Savior. 3. Jesus Christ's death on the cross is the only sacrifice that could remove the penalty of my sin. 4. Only those who trust in Jesus Christ alone as their Savior receive God's free gift of eternal salvation. In 2015, 33% of responders agreed with all four statements. In 2017, 24% of Americans said they were "Evangelical", but sadly only 15% strongly agreed with these four statements.

So as long as we understand the term "Evangelical" to refer to the gospel of Jesus as our only Hope of Salvation, and the Bible alone as our Final Authority for all we believe and practice, it is still a good term for our church. We believe these core truths and so does our denomination, the Evangelical Free Church of America. May we live out the gospel for the glory of God daily! Because of Christ,
