Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. (Acts 4:32 NRSV)

As I read these words from the Book of Acts they produce for me a vision of the perfect and loving church. Acts 4:32 is the passage pastors consider if they have been asked to describe their wish for the church. Every pastor likes to think this verse represents what the church in its most perfect form could be - a group of people who are of one heart and soul, joined in common by the head of the church – Jesus Christ. We give of ourselves and of our blessings and talents so that God's love is experienced fully in the community of believers. What a wonderful picture this verse from Holy Scripture frames in my mind and I hope in your mind also.

Unfortunately, the reason this verse is such an edifying text is because even before it was written – this idea had been incredibly difficult to attain. That is because we humans do not exist in a vacuum. We are constantly influenced by our surroundings, everything from where we live, to who our friends are, who raised us, and even what church we grew up in. (Of course the list is much broader than what I listed but you get the picture.) We are always being influenced in one way or another and for us to become of one heart and soul would be an immense undertaking that challenges every step of the way. And yet, our Living God asks us to do just that – to live and work on how we can come together in our heart and soul through faith in Christ Jesus.

Considering this verse then, it certainly would seem if someone wanted to accomplish what this verse suggests - that person would have to learn to compromise. Compromise is essential because the initial impression this passage expresses to the people who are the church is how they have to think alike. And to think alike would mean we have to move away from many of our other personal influences. This of course is not something that comes easy to any of us. So maybe as we contemplate what all this means, we need to consider the words that complete this verse. This verse concludes by revealing how all things are held in common.

And the most important thing we hold in common is not anything that is material. Sure the church needs material things to function and as the passage states, when we supply these things they become the property of the community. But the most important thing we hold in common is the fact that we all have needs. We all have needs that go way above our material wants and desires. We have spiritual and emotional needs that can only be fulfilled in community. The church is meant to be that community. Now the pastor can help with some of these needs, such as questions about the Spirit and religion, and the pastor can help with certain personal issues you are willing to share or with feelings of grief – but the ability of the community to recognize the needs of one another is what makes a good church great.

When the community shares with compassion and puts the needs of others first as Jesus taught through His own ministry, the church is being more than a social gathering or club. When the members are asking themselves – what is the need of my fellow Christian and how can I help them with that need, the church is being led by its true head and the greatness of what the Apostles intended the church to be is truly experienced!

As a community of faithful followers of Jesus Christ may we always strive to find a way to ask about the need of the other, even those people who come to us in anger. May we allow the Spirit of Christ in our soul to lead us to ask what the need of the other is as we open our hearts to finding a way to compromise. May Christ's way guide us in all we do as we continue to build this church into God's great community.



Reminder from Cemetery Association:

Guidelines for placing flowers and floral arrangements on the Ben Salem Cemetery

Due to the problems with wind carrying pieces of artificial flower arrangements into the neighboring farm fields - which become a hazard to machinery, crops and animals - and because they can also present a danger to our own mowing equipment - the following guidelines have been established by the Cemetery Association:

- 1. All types of real or potted plants are acceptable. Please remove colored foil from potted plant containers before placement. Any type of trees are not acceptable in the cemetery.
- 2. We ask that no artificial flowers and arrangements be placed on our cemeteries from May 1 through October 31.
- 3. Prior to placement of Christmas arrangements, make certain that artificial pieces are securely fastened to the arrangement.
- ****All Christmas arrangements should be removed from gravesites by March 1st weather permitting.
- 4. Appropriate signs for the guidelines will be placed at the cemeteries.
- 5. As a courtesy to persons living away from the area, floral arrangements may be placed at gravesites by contacting the Cemetery Association.
- 6. After April 30, the Cemetery Association will remove artificial arrangements.
- 7. Solar powered decorative sticks are acceptable by gravestones.
