In 2003, Mr. Roy P. Poillon created with a team of nurse clinicians, six disease management models while working with the nations second largest Home Healthcare provider. These models were implemented in over 250 sites nationwide, with MCO's that had large managed care populations.

There were three key areas for success; 1. Fidelity to the program design, 2. Realistic metrics and data collection, 3. Including the family through education and empowerment.

This model can be presented into any managed care organization with a mental health and addiction benefit. It is an Alternate Site of Care (Home Healthcare Agency) model.

CHRONIC DISEASE MANAGEMENT IN SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS

Managed Care Organizations, Home Health Care Agency, Primary Care and Family

The Initial Referral and Intake: The initial referral comes after completion of treatment. The case is recommended by managed care case management toward the end of a treatment facility service and a patient file is started with an in-network Primary Care Physician (PCP). The order for initial assessment is sent to the in-network disease management program participating Home Health Care Agency provider.

Initial Assessments: The HHA RN opens the case with an initial assessment: 1. Medical, 2. Mental Health, 3. Addiction (Assessment of Severity). A report of assessment is sent to MCO and PCP.

Plan of Care: The PCP writes a Plan of Care approved by Case Management at the MCO.

Quarterly Assessments The quarterly assessments are completed at the patient's home by the Home Healthcare Agency with an RN and Mental Social Worker.

Adjustments in Plan of Care: The PCP adjust the Plan of Care accordingly from the severity reports, with approvals from MCO Case Management.

Variance Responses: . When needed, variance responses are made to intervene in likely negative progressions, (going from Mild to Sever on Assessments metric indicators). This is completed by the PCP and MCO Case Management. A specialty service may be required from in-network provider. A copy to the HHA.


Outcomes Metrics and Reporting: The established protocols for metric measuring and reporting, with data collection tools will be implemented through all areas of the disease management process. Quarter updates are reported and reviewed. Adjustments to Plan of Care as made accordingly.
