Sermon

The Nicene Creed

Priest: Let us confess our faith, as we say,

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. He healed the sick and ate and drank with outcasts and sinners: He opened the eves of the blind and proclaimed the good news of your kingdom to the poor and to those in need. In all things he fulfilled Your gracious will. On the night He freely gave himself to death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when He had given thanks to you, He broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for You. Do this for the remembrance of Me." After supper He took the cup of wine; and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of Me." Gracious God, His perfect sacrifice destroys the power of sin and death; by raising Him to life You give us life for evermore.
