Announcements:

- Gala Damato, President—Thanked everyone for a great year. This was her last Day Meeting. Talked about Elections; Need parliamentarians for Day and Night Chapters; Night Chapter Meeting Greeter; Honor Quilts (since 2007); and we need someone to sell tickets for the Raffle Quilt.
- Linda Odell reminded everyone that Symposium will be April 18, 2020, every 3rd Monday of each month. We are looking for instructors, vendors and other committees. All information will be placed on the web after announcing. If you don't want to chair a committee, please come out and be on a committee. Let's make the Symposium another great event.
- Amy and Kathy—All minis were from Pat Winter's Estate Sale. Lois Bates was the donor for both minis. Fabric Basket made by Gala Damato, with miscellaneous items within, was won by Cathy Fowler. Buying Fabric Mini-Hanging quilted by Terry Hanson was won by Linda Odell.
- Marilyn Rivera showed the Block of the Month for June.
- Janette Doucette made announcement about the workshop after the June 14 meeting. The event will be 1-4 p.m. Workshop at Courthouse Way Community Center Annette Ornelas gives a workshop to accompany her Peeled Back Patchwork technique lecture, so we can have hands-on practice for this simple technique to make curves nice and flat in your quilt.
- Terri McHenry talked about Honor Quilts—just recently to Hanover Fire Department's Golf Tournament to honor three Firefighters: one deceased Fireman's quilt received by his family; one Firefighter who is still recouping from the accident; and the third quilt went to the Firefighter that had lost a leg. He's working to be the first Firefighter to serve with a prosthetic leg. Honor Quilts were also taken to Fisher House. Have some new quilts to be long-armed.

Some of the things talked about were: Diane Zeimet (Dritz Easy Hem, gloves and stretch and so; some of her favorite places were Missouri Star Quilt, Bear Creek Quilting, Craft Town Fabric, Shabby Fabrics, sewing.com, twochicks.com, heartbeato-fasewer.com, shoes with sewing machines on them, cutting mats and clips). Joan Kelly (heart pattern from a cereal box, uses lots of scraps, snips hearts with pinking shears to give a different look). Terry Hanson (10 ways to do something, 365 quilt 7/8 squares, sew with your left foot (better for your back), tape for alignment of fabric seams, small ironing board from AQS, Quilt in a Day ruler, setting seams to go from in to up (no wrinkles), Eleanor Burns has video with triangles, dog ears and flying geese should be pressed over to up. Karen Komatz talked about nifty ideas to clean up a sewing room. She showed slides of her neat and tidy sewing room and tips to stay organized.

Honor Quilts

On Friday, April 26 I traveled to The Hollows Golf Club in Montpelier, VA. I was there to present Honor quilts to Mrs. Melanie Clark, the widow of Lt. Brad Clark Station 6, Hanover Fire and EMS and Firefighter Carter Lewis and Firefighter Dave Johnson.

Last October, during Tropical Storm Michael, Station 6 responded to a motor vehicle accident on I-295. While on the scene of the accident, their truck was hit by a tractor trailer truck. Three firefighters were injured and one, Lt. Brad Clark, was pronounced dead at the scene. For Firefighter Carter Lewis it was his first day on the job. Firefighter Carter Lewis had to have his leg amputated because of injuries sustained in the accident. He is working diligently to be the first firefighter amputee to continue working. Firefighter Dave Johnson was in intensive care for months and is still undergoing intensive rehab.

It was a lovely day and the firefighting community, friends and families were there to play golf to raise money for their fallen. After introductions by the event coordinator, Tom Nelson, and welcome remarks from Fire Chief Jethro Piland, I was introduced and I asked the family of Lt. Brad Clark and Firefighter Carter Lewis to join me. I presented a guilt to Mrs. Clark and Lt. Brad Clark's father, Retired Fire Chief Bob Clark. I then presented Firefighter Carter Lewis with a guilt and presented Fire Chief Piland with a quilt for Firefighter Dave Johnson who could not be there. There were hugs and compliments on the workmanship and beauty of each quilt. A few of the other Fire Chiefs who were present approached me following the presentation asking for our contact information. I'd like to thank Linda Odell for arranging this presentation and won't be surprised if she is asked again to do a presentation.

I went to Fisher House on the Portsmouth Naval Hospital campus to drop off 10 quilts on May 9. Fisher House offers military and their families a place to call home while they are undergoing procedures or treatment at the hospital. These are families and patients that live 40 miles or more away from the hospital. A little girl had arrived from Italy with her parents, the day I dropped of quilts. They were excited to get 4 smaller sized quilts for the little ones who are there to undergo treatment. I also brought 25 mug rugs and Pat was happy to get them. She said she will give them to patients for their bedside tables.

I'd like to thank everyone who supports Honor quilts. It is a beautiful way to thank those who sacrifice to protect us in our communities and abroad.
