Sermon

The Nicene Creed

have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

He healed the sick and ate and drank with outcasts and sinners; He opened the eyes of the blind and proclaimed the good news of your kingdom to the poor and to those in need. In all things he fulfilled Your gracious will. On the night He freely gave himself to death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread, and when He had given thanks to you, He broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my body which is

given for You. Do this for the remembrance of Me." After supper He took the cup of wine; and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of Me." Gracious God, His perfect sacrifice destroys the power of sin and death; by raising Him to life You give us life for evermore.
