The Number 12 in the Bible

You'll find the number 12 used in 187 places in the Bible and there are some significances to this number as we will read. The number twelve seems to be very important to God and it represents, in most cases, the number of perfection and authority. The number 12 shows up in the Book of Revelation 22 times and are very important in that book and particularly in the New Jerusalem. Here are significances that are associated with the number 12.

12: the Number of Completeness

There were 12 tribes in Israel and this symbolizes the completeness of the nation Israel. Jacob had 12 sons which were the heads or fathers of each of the 12 tribes of Israel which are likened to 12 princes. When God appeared to Jacob, He told him: "Your name will not be called Jacob any longer. From now on your name will be Israel" (Gen 35:10). The name Jacob means "supplanter" which means "to supersede by force or treachery" which is what Jacob did when he took Esau's birthright for a bowl of stew (Gen 25:29-34) but now God is going to deal differently with Jacob because he repented of his supplanting ways and was now going to be called Israel, which in the Hebrew is "Yisra'el" and means "God prevails" which essentially means that Jacob stopped wrestling with God because he could not prevail against God (Gen 32:22-32).

Other Significances of the Number 12

Jesus chose 12 disciples who later became the 12 apostles which seem to fit the context of the number 12 used elsewhere in the Bible as this number also signified governmental rule or authority. The betrayer, Judas, was replaced by Matthias (Acts 1:23-26).

The New Jerusalem which descends out of heaven has 12 gates made of pearl which are manned by 12 angels. Each of the gates has been named after one of the 12 tribes of Israel.

In Revelation 7, twelve thousands from each of the 12 tribes of Israel will be saved near the end of the present world system.

The walls of the New Jerusalem are measured at 144 cubits high which is 12 multiplied by 12 (Rev 21:16).

The New City is also 12,000 furlongs squared (Rev 21:16).

There are 12 precious stones that will be used as the foundation of the New Jerusalem (Rev 21:19-20).

The wall of the city had 12 foundations with the 12 names of the apostles on each one (Rev 21:14).

Twelve thousand will be taken from the earth so that they may serve the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ (Rev 14:1-5).

The high priest's breastplate had 12 precious stones embedded within them.

Jesus very first words were spoken at the age of 12 (Luke 2:42).

There was even a woman who had suffered from a blood hemorrhage for 12 years (Luke 8:40).

There are 12 Minor Prophets in the Old Testament. They are called minor, not because they are less important than the Major Prophets, but due to their size being considerably smaller.

There are 12 historical books in the Bible: Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 Sam, 2 Sam, 1 Kings, 2 Kings, 1 Chronicles, 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther.

There were 12 loaves of permanent offerings on the golden table (Lev 24:5).

There were 12 explorers or spies sent into the land of Canaan (Due 1:23).

Solomon had 12 administrators in his kingdom (1 Kings 4:7).

There were 12 men who laid 12 stones in building a monument to the Lord (Joshua 4:3).

The Book of Chronicles contained 12 great priests.

Twelve curses were indicated for disobedience to Israel (Duet 27).

Digestion - Physical and Spiritual Affects the Whole Man!

In April 2018 issue of our newsletter, I started to share about the digestive system, as the Lord led. I touched a little bit on the importance of chewing our food properly.

Another look at why we should chew our food properly:

1. We absorb more nutrients and energy from our food.

Chewing breaks down food into small particles that are easily digested. As a result the intestines are able to absorb nutrients from the food as they pass through. Improperly digested food can enter into our blood stream causing a wide range of adverse effects on our health. Larger food particles that pass through the body can cause bacteria and fungi during their transit.

2. Properly chewed food helps us to maintain a healthy weight. The longer you chew, the longer you sit for a meal, and research shows that eating slowly can help you eat less...and control your portion sizes, which naturally decrease calorie consumption. It takes 20 minutes for your brain to signal to your stomach that you're full. Chewing slowly gives more exposure to our saliva. The digestive enzymes in the saliva have more time to start breaking food down the longer we chew, making digestion easier on the stomach and the small intestine. Saliva is also used as a lubricant so the pass of food is easier on our esophagus.

3. Properly chewed food is easier to digest and it allows our stomach to work

effectively. Digestion is actually a demanding task for our body, requiring a great deal of energy. When food is partially liquefied, it makes digestion easier and the body does not have to work two or three times as hard.

4. Chewing our food properly is good for our teeth. When we chew, the bones holding our teeth get a 'workout', helping to keep them strong. The saliva produced while chewing is also beneficial. It helps to clear food particles from our mouths and wash away bacteria so there may be less plaque buildup and tooth decay.

5. Properly chewed food lessens the amount of bacteria lingering in our intestines. When large food particles enter our stomach, it may remain undigested when it enters the intestines. There bacteria will begin to decay and produce an unpleasant smell, potentially leading to gas and bloating, diarrhea, constipation, abnormal pain, cramping and other digestive problems.

6. When we take the time to chew our food, we get to smell, taste and enjoy the flavor of our food. A rushed meal is not one we can enjoy.

Therefore, if we contrast the reading of the Word of God to a chopped up, rushed meal we will get the same results, spiritually.

When we take our time to sit in silence and slowly read the Word, without rushing through, we can get more benefits out of it, which I call "the nutrient of the Word."

While physical digestion is difficult on the body either way, spiritual digestion is best for the body's health and wellbeing. We don't need to count calories, the more of the right intake, the better.

Chowing down on the Word can give us spiritual indigestion, causing spiritual heart burn, which results in no peace. When we rush through the Word, He cannot take root and do the work within. As a result we gain no understanding. The Word sits dormant doing nothing for the believer and spiritual growth is hindered for lack of nutrient.

Slowly reading and meditating on the Word of God helps us to grow, maintain a healthy relationship with God and keep us close to Him. Quality time spent slowly chewing on the Word, allows the Word to complete the redemptive work in our hearts.

Without the Holy Spirit operating as our Saliva to produce digestive enzymes, (understanding), the Word does not get the opportunity to effectively do His work, because, as properly chewing techniques are needed to produce saliva, so does quality time and meditation, to invite and invoke the presence of Holy Spirit.

Spiritual Bacteria is *critical* to our health.



How Faith Speaks to Personality — *Miriam C. Desrosiers*

God cares for us both on a physical level and on a spiritual level. When it comes to personality, He gives us a healthy middle ground where if we are below the threshold, we are immature and not ready to deal with people and the world in a safe manner, and if we are too far above the threshold, our mental states and bodies react in an unhealthy way. When it comes to people with a Type A personality, for example, if they are too far below the middle ground they have a lot of anxiety and are self-conscious about how they behave and the tasks they have to do. If they become too far above the middle, they tend to have anxiety along with elevated stress levels and cardiac disorders because of the way that they are overworking themselves. Doing things by ourselves is not easy, which is why God gives us help, whether it be in the form of wisdom from His Word, or from others that live around us. Personality, according to Michael Gazzaniga, is defined by psychologists as, “a person’s characteristic thoughts, emotional responses, and behaviors”. These characteristics are what we call personality traits; they are patterns of thought, emotion, and behavior that remain relatively consistent over time and across different situations (Gazzaniga, Psychological Science, 2016, p. 549). The same underlying processes that shape our personalities happen in everyone, but because our experiences and situations (environment, culture, biological influences, etc.) are all different, we, too, are different. Personality psy-

chologists have come up with and enhanced the five-factor theory, which identifies the five basic personality traits as openness, conscientiousness, extraversion, agreeableness, and neuroticism (Gazzaniga, 2016, p. 563). The HEXACO model, which was developed later, added the honesty/humility scale to the original five. According to the HEXACO Personality Inventory:

Persons with very high scores on the Honesty-Humility scale avoid manipulating others for personal gain, feel little temptation to break rules, are uninterested in lavish wealth and luxuries, and feel no special entitlement to elevated social status. Conversely, persons with very low scores on this scale will flatter others to get what they want, are inclined to break rules for personal profit, are motivated by material gain, and feel a strong sense of self-importance. ("THE HEXACO PERSONALITY INVENTORY - REVISED") Speaking on humility, not enough of it in a person can lead to excessive pride, while too much of it can cause a person to think of themselves as someone who is too low to receive any kind of praise. Being proud prevents people from asking others for help. This is especially true when it comes to God, which is why He hates it (Proverbs 8:13 ESV). He wants us to be able to ask Him for help and pray so that we can develop and continue to keep a relationship with Him. Being too proud to ask anyone for help makes it difficult to form these relationships with anyone, and not coming to God with any burden that we have can limit

the blessings He has in store for us. Having too much humility can cause a person to forget that they are made in God’s image because of the way they dismiss any praise for their works; if they were to constantly shift the praise from themselves and on to others, especially those who did not work as hard as they did, they would begin to tarnish how they see themselves in their mind and diminish how valuable they are to have around others. In doing so, they would begin to forget Psalm 139:13-16, which states how wonderfully God formed them to be and that He saw who they were and the lives they would be living before they were even a thought.
