Multi-Jurisdictional Agreement In Regarding:

Waupaca County's Comprehensive Planning Effort To Meet requirements of Wisconsin's Comprehensive Planning and Smart Growth Legislation

WITNESSETH:

Whereas, Waupaca County will apply for a local assistance grant via the Wisconsin Department of Administration for the purposes of preparing a County-wide Comprehensive Plan in the fall of 2002.

Whereas, the estimated cost of this multi-year planning effort, providing every unit of government in the county participates, will be approximately \$1,000,000.

Whereas, the anticipated state grant share of the project, providing every unit of government in the county participates, will be approximately \$455,000 plus \$91,000 "bonus dollars" for multijurisdictional collaborations.

Whereas, Waupaca County's anticipated share would be \$265,000 minus those "bonus dollars" obtained from the state grant.

Whereas, the Town of Farmington's financial responsibility would be \$1,875 per year for four (4) budget years 2003 through 2006 totaling \$7,500.

NOW, THERFORE, IT IS AGREED by and between the parties as follows:

1. Each party of the second party shall be entitled to have at least one representative on county committees established to develop the Waupaca County Comprehensive Plan.

- 2. All residents and landowners within the geographic boundary of the Town of Farmington shall be entitled to express their views on the plan as part of the entire citizen participation plan established as part of the comprehensive planning effort.
- 3. Waupaca County will provide the overall leadership for this effort; preparing the grant application for the fall 2002 grant deadline; utilizing a consultant, support from the Waupaca County Economic Development Corporation and/or others, as needed, to prepare the comprehensive planning grant application.
- **4.** Waupaca County will employ a "county planner" as part of the grant request to coordinate and facilitate this planning effort.
- 5. Waupaca County will postpone the anticipated time schedule including the employment of a "county planner" and development of the comprehensive plan, if Waupaca County does not receive a local assistance planning grant from the State of Wisconsin.
