

Notes from the VP

This is an excerpt from Eugene Burger's booklet,
"Growing in the Art of Magic" (1992)

Chapter 1 - GROWING

"And so I ask you: Are we growing in the art of magic when we are reading books? Let me put it another way. Which of the following activities do you think would most promote personal growth for you?

- 1. Reading a magic book about coin tricks for four hours, or
- 2. Reading a magic book about coin tricks for 30 minutes and then locking yourself in a room for three and a half hours without the book, but with some half-dollars and a mirror

I'll leave you to ponder that question for yourself. And the answer becomes clear to you.

Another question that I think we need to ask ourselves is: "What is the relation between growing and listening?" If we are really to grow, don't we need to stop talking for a while and begin listening? Most of us are talking most of the time,

not always verbally of course, but inwardly. The little voice in the head, the endless chatter in the skull, commenting, evaluating, weighing, judging. But to grow don't we also need to be quiet? Don't we need to listen to others and to the world around us and, most of all, let us not forget to listen to ourselves, to our own imagination, our own dreams.

One of the problems I always had with school is that they were always telling me what my dreams should be, and seldom giving me the time to stop and listen to what my dreams actually were. I suppose that we could say an important part of growing is learning to ask the important questions. We need, in fact, to learn to ask the right questions at the right time.

In magic it seems that the vast majority of magic books have lost sight of what the important questions are. They are concerned instead with the very tiny part of what magic is about, namely, how different magic tricks work. Yet if our dream is to perform magic to a great response from audiences, if that is our dream, how the magic tricks work is, well, it's rather on the level of the child in kindergarten playing with toys and discovering how they work. How the magic tricks work is only the beginning of the magical journey.

The last thing I would like to mention by the way of introduction, is the relation of growing and caring. If we are to grow in the magical art, we need to approach our magic with great care and love. The depth of our care and concern for our magic is the key to any success we might achieve as magicians. In one sense, each of us involved in the art of magic is very much like a gardener tending a garden. If the gardener forgets the garden, or if he visits it only rarely, or does not give it his deep attention, the weeds will overtake it and any sense of order and design will be lost. On the other hand, if the gardener exerts great care and love for his garden, it will grow in marvelous ways.

Is this how we want our involvement in the art of magic to grow? Are we ready to give our magical garden new attention and care? If we are, we are on the path to growing in the art of magic."

This was just an except from the first chapter of this booklet which contains ten illuminating chapters. Eugene Burger hit on something very important. There is something more to making "magic" than merely learning the trick itself. How the trick is approached and then interpreted, and then presented and translated to the audience, that is the key to magic. Lots to think about when opening up that next trick you just got in the mail.
