In this season of COVIDTIDE, like you, I've been keenly aware of losses and diminishment, disappointment and constraint. It is easy, sooooo easy to call out the list of hard things we've had to accommodate. It has been both worrying and wearisome. What is also true is that this time has brought to light some dust and dirt piling up in our old normal. We knew we were overscheduled and distracted from simple pleasures. We knew life was passing quickly leaving many of us without time for creative, restorative reflection. We had fallen in the habit of taking access to friends and family for granted. We assumed communities that fed our spirits would always be opened for us whenever we wanted to drop in. When things shuttered down we were left with time and few places to spend it. It was hard and it was lonesome.

And suddenly, surprisingly we discovered *imposed* Sabbath. We began to create new patterns, new rituals in our days that brought us calm and revived our spirits. Families came together around the table at dinner time instead of being spread across the county. Couples starting cooking together. People sat outside on a Tuesday night, a Tuesday night of all times and listened to the birds. As the rules changed, people pulled lawn chairs out to the front lawn and spoke to neighbors. Patient people taught elders how to Zoom and click through FACEBOOK options to see friends and send comments. People showed up on virtual platforms to say Morning Prayer. They took a break midafternoon and listened to a reflection. In the evening, they hit a button and said Night Prayers with members of their church and discovered strangers found their way to the site as well. There was a sense of oneness and holiness in space between the screens, our homes and the spoken words.

Even those who didn't join in felt supported knowing prayers were being shared by people who knew and cared about them by name.

More than the cadre of church ladies asked if they could help reach out to members who lived alone. Faithful folk called to ask are vou well? Do vou need something, would vou let us help vou with that?

People not financially stretched by the crisis sent their COVID Bucks to the church saying send this to a person in need. Give it where it will do the most good. In the anxiety of the virus came the pause. In the pause, the small still voice was heard. Don't be in a rush to rejoin the rush. Remember the grace you found in this normal. Remember what was gained in the loss. Remember the lessons, feelings, connections, the good.

It is the way of God to show up in the chaos with something unexpected and deeply meaningful. Let us be wise to what has been revealed. In the mayhem and disruption, God was there. Let us give thanks for the grace we received.

Peace be with you as Covidtide continues and God reigns supreme,





A kitchen will be built that will bring fellowship, teach important life skills and provide hope to legions of area women.

To get to this point, we have crossed many hurdles. From assuring and reassuring the diocese that we've done our homework, to securing a bank loan, finding the right contractors and dealing with county bureaucracy. At every step, we could feel your prayers and God's hand in guiding us through. And despite difficult times across the globe, St. Mark's remains financially solid and ready to take the next step in this journey. Our pledges, both annual and for the building, continue to come in. Our Vestry and building team continue to be good stewards of our finances.
