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Children's Services

- Children with developmental disabilities are now served by the Department of Children & Families (DCF) until age 21
- □ Transfer completed January 1, 2013
- Call PerformCare for services/supports -(877) 652-7624



Planning for Adult Life

- Students between the ages of 16-21 & their families
- Series of training modules, materials, and resources
- □ Help with visioning for the future

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DDD Eligibility

- □ 18 years of age (21+ for services)
- Resident of New Jersey
- □ Functional Criteria DD
- Medicaid eligibility (continually maintained)
 - □ DDD.MediElighelpdesk@dhs.state.nj.us

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Previously Deemed Eligible for DDD?

- □ 16 or older on 1/1/2013 maintains status as having met functional criteria
- □ Under 16 on 1/1/2013 need to go through intake process again (at 18 or older)



Employment First

- Initiative announced by Governor Christie on April 19, 2012
- "Competitive employment in the general workforce is the first and preferred post education outcome for people with any type of disability"

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Comprehensive Medicaid Waiver

- □ Approved by CMS on October 1, 2012
- Statewide reform of NJ's Medicaid systemstrategic plan for change
- Community-based services v. institutional services
- Allows NJ to draw down increased federal matching funds

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Medicaid Services Medicaid Services (21+) Community Care Supports Waiver (CCW) Program (SP)



2013 Graduates

- Vast majority already Medicaid eligible and working with case managers on planning
- Most 2013 grads will go directly onto the Supports Program (SP) as soon as it is implemented
- In the meantime, 2013 grads will go into support coordination and begin the transition into the new system

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Contracted Programs

- Operate year round (minimum 230 days/year)
- □ 5 hours/day, 5 days/week. Hours vary
- Provide transportation within a defined geographic area
- □ 1:6 ratio- staff to program participant

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Contracted Special Needs Programs

- Designed for those who need intensive supports
- Enhanced staff supports typical ratio is
- May provide support services, e.g. nursing, behavioral supports, or mental health supports
- Offer many of the same opportunities as other contracted programs



Self-Directed Day Services (SDDS)

- Guided by the vision that people with disabilities will determine their own futures, with the appropriate assistance from families and friends
- Opportunity for individuals and their families to promote choice in their day service option

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SDDS

- People have individualized budgets for DDD Day Services.
- All supports and services must be habilitative or provide individual supports so that a person can increase independence and build upon their skills.


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
Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

- Interagency agreement between:
 - DDD Division of Developmental Disabilities
 - □ DVRS Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services
 - □ CBVI Commission for the Blind & Visually Impaired
- Defines the supported employment roles and responsibilities of each agency
- Promotes collaboration and communication between agencies to improve service provision



What should/can I do now?

Complete the DDRT (online/phone survey)
Contact your DDD Case Manager (CM) & discuss your post graduation plan
Start the eligibility process with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) for employment supports
Explore needed post graduation supports and services





What will DDD do?

- CM will gather information & inform
 Regional Adult Services or Self Directed
 Supervisors of your plan to either:
 - "Self-direct" your services and utilize a variety of providers and/or self hires to provide services & supports
 - □ Choose one contracted provider who will provide the services/supports that are needed

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Support Coordination

- Individual/family will have the option to choose Support Coordination (SC) Agency
 - SC Agency of choice will then be assigned as long as it serves the county of residence and has capacity
- No expressed preference or cannot be assigned to preferred SC Agency
 - Auto assigned through an electronic process ("round robin")

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Support Coordination

- Facilitates person-centered planning process
 - □ Person-Centered Planning Tool (PCPT)
- Develops Individualized Service Plan
 - New for 2013 graduates & new presenters
 - Uniform plan replaces Essential Lifestyle Plan (ELP) and Individual Habilitation Plan (IHP)

Coming Soon... The Supports Program! 2013 graduates and new presenters (after June 1, 2013) – first group rolled into Supports Program (once operationalized) Enrollment of others to being very soon thereafter

Supports Program
 Services/supports for individuals living in their own homes or with their families
 Provides Individualized Budgets (based on assessed level of need)

Employment/Day services
 Individual & family support services (\$5,000, \$10,000, \$15,000)

Administrative (support coordination and FI)


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

- Other
 - Transportation (available to services, activities, and resources specified in the service plan – including employment)
- Administrative Services
 - Support Coordination
 - Fiscal Management Services (Fiscal Intermediary)

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Community Care Waiver (CCW)

- Individuals whose needs cannot be met on the Supports Program will be served on the CCW
 - Must meet functional criteria and be Medicaid eligible
 - Must meet DDD's "emergency" criteria or reach top of CCW Waiting List
- Residential, in-home supports, and employment & day supports are all available

Community Care Waiver (CCW) Services can be provided in-home or in residential settings Intended to serve individuals with more intensive needs CCW Waiting List – reform needed
