October 17th 2019

Interior Health came to town. Mayor Roden of Ashcroft worked with them to facilitate the meeting. They told us about the services we are supposed to have in our community. They told us they didn't have time to answer all the questions, and they would send answers to the unanswered questions to Mayor Roden for communication to those who attended or were interested.

## Healthcare Area Planning Table

Another meeting was held in January. Thankfully Leanne Davies was available to attend the meeting and the table has agreed that we can have an alternate..

LeAnne was appreciated for her expertise and input at the meeting and has been invited to join regularly in addition to me.

Information was shared about physician recruitment and the challenges they have assimilating into our communities. It was recommended the community embrace them more proactively than we have.

Interior Health is still working hard at keeping the emergency department open on weekends, staffing and recruiting is continuing to be a priority. It does have its challenges.

Mayor Roden has asked that a separate working group be struck to discuss emergency services and a seven day per week model. Tabled for later discussion according to Mayor Roden.

A new physician is rumoured to be arriving shortly, at the time of writing this newsletter, we are still waiting for some details about the new arrival.
