



Several years ago, I read the book "The Minister's Charge" by William Dean Howells. At one point in book, one of the characters makes the observation "how much easier it was to make one's peace with one's God than with one's wife". My thought was to question if that could be said of me? Am I easy to make peace with?

In several places of scripture it says to forgive others as we are forgiven; forgiveness results in coming to peace with one another. The so called Lord's Prayer contains a reference of this nature (Matthew 6:12 with commentary Mathew 6:14-15). Paul repeats this instruction in Ephesians "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." (4:32). Clearly, God's instructs us to forgive others as God has forgiven us. A higher standard than most of us live by. The gospels tell us about the suffering that Jesus endured in our place. How often do we

spit on Christ by continuing to violate God's laws? Still, if we have trusted in Christ's atonement for our sins, we stand before God forgiven. Do we forgive others to that extent? When we stand before Christ forgiven we have peace with Him.

When someone offends us, do we forgive as easily as God does? Do we forgive as easily as Jesus Christ does? Or, do we make the offender work to be forgiven? One of the things that separates true Christianity from false religions is that because of what Jesus Christ has done for us on the cross, we don't have to work for our forgiveness to achieve peace with God (Eph 1:7). In 1 John, we learn that confession of our sins, God is willing and anxious to forgive us (1:9).

The apostle Paul wrote to his young protégé that the law is for the lawless, not the obedient. Its purpose is to show us that we cannot live by God's standard in our own strength. The more we know of the law, the more it condemns us (1 Tim. 1:8ff). Consequently we are in conflict with God and we must be reconciled to God to avoid His condemnation. As undeserving as we are, God reaches down to us extending forgiveness and peace to us.

When we are offended, do we reach out offering forgiveness as God demonstrated? Are we ready to forgive when forgiveness is sought by the one who offends us? God is our example of forgiving, may it be our goal to be as forgiving to others as God is to us. May we establish peace with others as God has desired peace with us.



Pat Answers

Why Didn't Mary Magdalene Recognize Jesus after **His Resurrection?**

I know it is not Easter until April this year, but someone recently asked this question. John 20:14 says about Mary "...she turned around and saw Jesus standing, but did not know that it was Jesus." If Jesus did arise in the same body that was crucified, why didn't she recognize Him immediately? There are several reasons: 1. it may have been still partially dark or very early light - see John 20:1 This makes more sense in the context as Mary had just stooped to today? One proof of the resurrection of Jesus is that look into the empty tomb again and saw two angels in white just prior to Jesus appearing. Perhaps their shiny appearance - see Matthew 28:3 - had blazed on even needed proof. Another precious truth for us is her eyes and now it is darker as she turns toward where Jesus is standing! 2. She may not have taken a close look at him as none of the followers of Christ actually expected Him to arise! They just didn't get it until after it actually happened. So she just assumes He is the gardener or caretaker. Notice also verse 16 says she turned toward Jesus when He said her name. She simply may have not made eye contact yet. 3. Jesus' body was different than she would have last seen on the cross! Isaiah 52:14 says of God's suffering Servant: "His appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance..." He had literally been

beaten to a bloody pulp, His beard pulled out, and then crucified...This was her last memory of Jesus. She may have been totally unprepared to see a healthy restored youthful appearing Jesus! This not recognizing Jesus did not last long. She immediately recognized HIM in John 20:16 when He said her name!

Who cares? What can we glean from this for us His followers did not expect it - like Mary it took them by surprise too! They were slow to believe it and that, like Mary, Jesus knows His own sheep by name - John 10:3. What a wonderful comfort for the follower of Christ! Finally, all who have received Jesus as Savior and are linked to Him by faith will rise with new glorious resurrection bodies like His - 1 John 3:2. We may look a bit different with complete glory, but we will still be recognized! Even so, come quickly, Lord Jesus! Because He lives, Pastor Pat
