Georgia-Russia-West Triangle – Shared and Conflicting Interests is a format of regular expert workshop that brings together leading analysts and opinion makers from Georgia and Russia, as well as the US and European countries. The workshop deals with security issues in the former Soviet Union (with special focus on the Black Sea security and Georgian-Russian relations) and the Russian-Western relations in the light of the conflict in the Ukraine and the Western sanctions against Russia. How far can the Russian-Western confrontation go and what are the implications of this confrontation for the former Soviet states, in particular for Georgia that aspires to integrate with the EU and NATO? Why does it happen that Russia and the West struggle to find modus vivendi? Do Russia and Georgia have common interests that may help them overcome differences and move ahead? Can the West contribute to normalization of Georgian-Russian relations and thus contribute to security in wider EU area as well? These are a few of questions that the workshop tries to deal with
