**EPISCOPAL EVANGELISM CONFERENCE** 



I recently had the opportunity to travel to Cleveland with 400 other Episcopalians from 80 dioceses to the second **Evangelism Matters** Conference. It involved two full days of plenary sessions and workshops, with preaching and teaching by our CEO (Chief Evangelism Officer) The Most Reverend Michael Curry. As I told Sarah, it was kind of like drinking from a fire hose. While there's no way to cover everything that went on or was taught, I want to share with you some of the What, Why, and How of evangelism.

#### What

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

As Bishop Curry pointed out, this is known as the "Great Commission", not the "Great Suggestion". We are all called to share the good news. Being what it is, the Episcopal Church developed a tweetable description of Episcopal evangelism: We seek, name and celebrate Jesus' loving presence in the stories of all people – then invite everyone to MORE. #EpiscopalEvangelism. He also pointed out that the last 50 years have produced a transformation within the Episcopal Church with regard to outreach, with most parishes recognizing that as an integral part of their life. He calls us as members of the church to drive the same transformation with regard to evangelism.

### Why

We don't evangelize to increase our membership, to produce more pledges, or to build up the church. We evangelize to make the world a better place. People need to know the love of Jesus, and the world needs more people who do, and who love others accordingly.

#### How

I have to brag here that I was quoted in the closing presentation for a tongue in cheek complaint to the Canon for Evangelism. After sitting through a day and a half of workshops on a myriad of topics, I complained that they were getting repetitious. It was all "pray, listen, love, serve, tell".

Pray for awareness of God's love for us. Pray that He will stir up our love for Him and for others. Pray that He will give us eyes to see others as He sees them.

Look for God at work in the world. Listen to those around you. Be ready with words of encouragement or comfort.

Keep doing what we're doing. A common theme of the conference is that evangelism without justice, compassion, and service is empty. We are already engaged in those things. We need to keep in mind why, and not be secretive about it. We love and serve because God says we should and we believe Him.

Invite others to more. Friends who may not (yet) be interested in coming to church, might be interested in attending a racial reconciliation event or W.I.N.E. or the Knights' Game or a youth event or a pet blessing.

As we step out on the path of evangelism, keep a few things in mind.

- 1. We don't have to take God out into the world; He's already there.
- 2. We don't need to deliver a great speech and convert someone to Christ; we just need to encourage the work that God is already doing in that person.
- 3. The world will not be transformed by priests and bishops; it will be transformed by all of us, because all of us are the ones being transformed by Christ.

I invite you to join me and Episcopalians across the church in this work because, Evangelism Matters,


