Since the 1930's the Lafayette Historic Azalea Trail has attracted thousands upon thousands of visitors annually to enjoy the splendor of the azaleas. In the 1980's Southern Living Magazine designated Lafayette's Azalea Trail one of the top 20 destinations in the south! Thankfully we are still a top tourist destination. We are passionate about our azaleas and want to pass this on to the next generation.

Lafayette neighborhoods and businesses have great potential to be a part of the "Azalea City" promotion. which also helps bring attention to our Historic Azalea Trail! We are seeking your help as a homeowner or business owner to consider the following landscaping efforts:

- Selectively prune azaleas only in the spring right after the flowers faded away and before July. Azaleas begin to grow their flower buds in July and late summer. Mulch around the base of the bushes.
- Hedge trimming or invasive cutting back is not necessary as azaleas do best when allowed to grow naturally.
- If you don't currently have azaleas, please plant azaleas in your front yard in the fall or early spring.
- Beautify your front porch with container azaleas during the bloom season in early spring.
- Adopt azaleas in public spaces near your home by removing vines and small trees and/or mulching.
