Ministry Notes

We're back from vacation and catching up... I wish to say thank you for the opportunity to take some time away. It's important in all our lives that we change the scenery and do some reflecting on our routines.

Kris and I spent eight days on a small island off the coast of Scotland called Iona. It was a place where Christian pilgrims have been visiting for centuries.

We stayed in a place called the Bishops House, which was a fully functioning Episcopal church. My morning stated with a communion service at eight. The communion chalice and plate were hundreds of years old. Attendance was small and we gathered around the altar for distribution. It was an intimate service.

After breakfast I would go hiking or attend a writing workshop. One of the retreat leaders was an accomplished Poet, and his words were like magic. He had a way of describing things that made me pay attention and wonder.

On a particular hike we went to a place called the hill of angels. A dozen of us stood on the peak and just gazed out in all directions. As everyone stood there, observing the beauty, the group became mysteriously quiet. And everyone honored the

silence as we looked out in all directions-- taking in all that was there to see and hear.

It was unusual. I don't think I've ever been in a group of people who fell quiet, and stayed that way! No one needed to speak, no one needed to break the silence.

A hawk flew overhead, sheep in the distance were quietly grazing, a farmer went about his business... The quiet was unplanned; somehow it fell upon us... And it seemed like it was the way it was supposed to be.

After maybe fifteen minutes of quiet, the retreat leader broke the silence by reading a poem he had written during the time we were standing and quiet. He ended the poem by saying the hill of angels was still a hill of angels. Meaning that we were all those angels...

And I thought, yes, in our baptismal identity, we are also Saints. The sin around us is so visible and prevalent and life can sometimes be so despairing. But, yes, we are also Saints...

In all our pilgrimages through life, may we always remember that we are also Saints. I pray we find those unusual quiet times, and reflect on our being created in the image of God.

Blessing to you and your families this month as we give thanks for all that God has given us.



The agenda was approved with two additions under new business and the September meeting minutes were approved with a small wording correction under finance.

CONSOLIDATION

120 years ago - the Cannon River, Welch and Prairie Island churches consolidated to become one parish <u>but</u> continued as three separate congregations in 1899. Images of the three churches can be found on a commemorative plate.



Back in 1877 the Vasa, Welch and Cannon River churches met to consolidate congregations to no, avail.

Early in 1960 a resolution by the Prairie Island congregation to consolidate with the Swedish Evangelical Lutheran church of Welch (or Welch Lutheran as it had come to be more commonly

known) was made. The Welch Lutheran church unanimously accepted Prairie Island members. The newly merged groups chose the name Cross of Christ Lutheran as their new church designation.
