FREE SHINGLES VACCINE FOR PEOPLE 70-79 YEARS

Vaccinations don't stop at childhood.

Protect yourself against **Shingles**

Shingles is a painful blistering rash caused by the same virus that causes chickenpox. One in three people will develop shingles in their lifetime. As a person gets older, the risk of getting shingles increases.

Shingles can be very painful and lead to serious, long-term complications, in particular for older people.

A free shingles vaccine program is available under the Australian Government's National Immunisation Program for 70 year olds, with a time-limited catch-up program for people 71 to 79 years old until October 2021.

The vaccine is available from your general practitioner or vaccination provider. Ask your general practitioner or vaccination provider about other free vaccines you may be eligible for.

Come and see us at Flexi Care Podiatry and we can get your feet summer-ready. We have 10 clinics and offer home visits to those eligible. We provide a low cost, high quality treatment and also offer **free Podiatry consultations** until the 1st July 2018 for Commonwealth Home Support Program eligible clients which includes frail older people over age 65 and 50 years and over for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people that need assistance with daily living to maintain independence at home and in the community.

Do you or someone in your household have a disability or mobility condition and need to change something around the home to make things easier to use, access or get around? Are you a carer or care giver who needs minor modifications made to your home to make it safer and easier for you to care for a person with a disability or mobility condition?

For a limited time only, MGCCI has funding available to undertake minor home modifications for eligible people living in the program areas below, between 1st February and the 30th of June 2018.

Eligibility

 \checkmark People under 65yrs or Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander People under 50yrs \checkmark People at risk of losing their independence

 \checkmark People with a disability or medical condition that affects their ability to carry out daily activities

 \checkmark Live in any of the catchment areas*

If you are eligible, we are standing by to discuss and determine with you your home modification needs, and to mobilise our team of access workers and qualified trade contractors to get the job done. If required we can also make a direct referral to a team of local and trusted Occupational Therapists ready to undertake and fast-track subsidised assessments for eligible people where required.

Minor Modifications

•Structural home changes to increase and maintain a person's functional independence to live capably & safely in their own home eg: installing hand & shower rails, hand-held-shower hose, building ramps, installing easy turn taps and accessable light switches and installing keysafes.
