We have had a busy start to the year, settling in to our new environment. We celebrated Australia Day by painting flags and Australian animals. We have been having sensory experiences, some slimy bubbly, playdough, coloured ice and paint bags. These sensory activities allow explorations and naturally encourage children to use scientific processes while they play.

We had a living safely with dogs visit where we learnt about different rules when being around dogs. We also had the opportunity to put this into practice by meeting a dog and giving him a pat. We followed up this experience by painting some puppies.

Welcome to the Snake Room for 2018. Our Snake friends have all settled happily into our new Centre and their rooms, with everyone already displaying a wonderful sense of wellbeing and belonging.

Throughout the year in the Snake Room we will be working on developing many skills that will make the transition to school easier. We will inform you of your school readiness goal in the near future and also ask for your input for goals for your children.

We began the year exploring our country Australia to celebrate Australia Day. We also explored Chinese New Year with some fun dragon/ lion dancing with Chinese music. We participated in Chinese craft, as well as some Chinese cooking of yummy fried rice. Thank you to Eric's mum for providing some delicious dumplings for the children to enjoy as well as the fantastic Chinese lion head costume. These types of experiences broaden the children's knowledge of the work around them as they gain an understanding of diversity that exists in our community (learning outcome 2 of EYLF and QA partnerships with family and Principle 2 family partnerships).

In response to some our children's interest in the beach and Cohen's interest in fishing we set up our 'Under the Sea' area for the children to explore and investigate life under the sea. We have been enjoying sea life books and stories, group time language aids such as puppets and shells, sea life songs, as well as fun creating sea life arts and crafts.

This interest centre relates to Practice 2 responsiveness to the children's interest within our program.

We have all enjoyed drawing ourselves to put with our photos as a welcome display in our room. Don't forget to look for your child's picture - they are all very proud of them.

These drawings promote the children's sense of identity and belonging to their room and the Centre.

We have also been exploring the many different types of feathers that the children have been finding in our natural environment – this began with the moulting of our resident peacock. The children are placing their feathers in our feather basket as they try and identify what type of bird the feather has come from using the provided identification bird charts. This experience relates to Learning Outcome 2 as they explore their natural world and Outcome 4 as they use their problem solving and investigative skills.

The news opportunities promote the children's language skills and confidence with speaking before the group – their very first public speaking experiences! This relates to Learning Outcome 5 communication skills.

The NSW Government runs a program which tests the vision of all 4 year old children. Nurses will visit our Centre on Wednesday, March 14 and Thursday, March to test the children's vision. If your child is 4 years old and didn't get tested last year, you would have received a consent pack this week. If you could please fill in the required paperwork and return it to the Snake staff or the office as soon as possible.

News from the Office ...

IMPORTANT REMINDER: Immunisation

Please remember to provide us with an updated immunisation history statement when your child has their next immunisation. This is a statutory requirement. The regulation changed on January 1, 2018 and children are not able to attend child care in Australia unless their immunisation is up to date!

Transition to Child Care Subsidy from July 1

As you may be aware, the Australian Government is replacing the child care rebate and benefit with one single payment, the child care subsidy from July 1 and this will affect your gap payment for child care.

To calculate an estimate of the gap you will be liable for your child's care with us after July 1, please visit the government calculator under the following link: https://www.education.gov.au/sites/education/files/chcare/est/index.html

The Government will provide you with further information from April and we will update you as well as new details become available.
