City shortly after their marriage. Dave and Val are longtime members of Cornerstone Church and have raised three grown children. Their two girls


are living in San

home and commercial renovation business. Helping with his father-in-law's company, Dave ran their Grass Valley location for many years. That experience ultimately led Dave to take over the entire business. Hawkins Exteriors now specializes in windows, siding and patio covers and keeps both Dave and Val on the run.

Dave's passion to serve people was fanned by Val and together they sought to make a difference in the Yuba Sutter community. Dave maintains a scriptural approach to his faith and notes that Christ taught about caring about people without questioning or judging their missteps or poor decisions. Looking for an opportunity to serve, Dave and Val responded to a newspaper ad asking for volunteers to work providing a winter season shelter. That organization became FEWS which utilized the empty Walton fire station to house homeless families during the winter of 2009-10.

FEWS largely broke apart after that season, but Dave and Val and a couple others met to form another organization that would bring area churches together in partnership to provide a rotational shelter. The Regional Emergency Shelter Team (REST) was incorporated as a faith based nonprofit and is now entering its third season. With Dave's leadership, REST has been extremely successful providing over 4,300 beds and many more meals for single women and families who have nowhere else to go.
