The overlocker workshop at The Stitching Circle went very well with 5 students of different levels all learning lots and going home with many samples and brain overload. Being in a craft and sewing store when you get paid to teach is a dangerous thing! I bought a fabric cutting machine called Go!Baby that has templates to cut different shapes from up to 6 layers of fabric at a time.

So much easier to cut accurate circles and flower shape quickly.

It has plates with the templates that you place the fabric on top of then roll under the press. The cut out shapes pop out of the fabric. There are a heap of different shapes for quilting blocks, embellishments and geometric.

Evil Queen update, I have found the pattern

for my costume and I am now working on the elaborate embroidery/lace/beading work on the sleeves and back of the collar. I think a special trip to DK fabric might be in order to find some brocade fabric suitable for the dress. The Evil Queen has also lost another 3 kg since the last newsletter!!

What is Tyvek?

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Tyvek is non woven spun bond man made man "fabric" used originally for things like crime scene cleanup suits. You can paint it with watered down acrylic paint or procion dye then heat it gently with an iron to create unpredictable bubbles. Sew it in layers between crystal organza than zap with a heat gun to melt away sections.
