In Science, 4th graders will be reading about vertebrates and invertebrates and 5th grade will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 1. In English, both grades have been reviewing subject and predicate. This week we will start in our handwriting and VocabuLit workbooks. In Social Studies, 4th grade will continue learning about the Midwest region and 5th grade will be reading about the pilgrims and the first Thanksgiving.  $6^{\text{th}}/7^{\text{th}}/8^{\text{th}}$: In reading, we have been working hard on vocabulary strategies and using stories to determine author purpose and style. We will utilize informational text stories this week. In grammar, we are completing a unit on the nature of sentences, and we will be starting on a project in which students will be writing narratives. In math, 6th grade is studying the nature of operations, identifying operation-patterns in story problems, and looking at types of multi-step problems. Seventh grade is looking at operations with fractions and story problem patterns. Eighth grade is working on story problem patterns, using factor strategies on larger numbers, and fraction-decimal-percent requirements. Don't forget that Stanford testing starts next week.
