Celebrating Thirty Years

PPQG is celebrating 30 years so we're asking our past presidents to share their memories of when they held office. First up is Donna D'Amelio. She served as PPQG President 2011-2013. She has been a member since 2003. Here are a few questions we had for Donna.

What big event happened during your term as President? (Symposium, Quilt Show or other)

I was President during the planning stages of the Quilt Show in 2013. We also had several big speakers come to our guild: Susan Brubaker Knapp, Jane Sassaman, and Pat Speth.

Share a favorite memory from your term.

My favorite memory was having a very successful Quilt Show. I wasn't directly involved in the planning stages of the show but my vicepresident, Sandy Barnes was. She did a fabulous job! It was great having so many members working together to make the show such a success. I was very proud of Janet Dyer and Susan Smith who co-managed the show but I'm also proud of everyone who volunteered.

What was one of the Challenges proposed to PPQG members back then?

I don't really know how to answer this one. I think the Quilt Show was the biggest challenge and getting all the volunteers for such a big event was a challenge in itself. I had my own personal challenge in 2011. I started out as Vice-President and became President by default when our President resigned and I had to take over her duties. I don't see myself as a leader, so this was a real challenge for me. I think I did okay.

What service projects do you remember doing under your term as President?

Quilts of Valor was our main service project and was headed by Crystalann Durate. Our Small Service Projects, headed by Gala Damato and Yvette Cienski, included making Bereavement Quilts for babies, breast cancer pillows and making wheel chair wraps for Meals on Wheels. These ladies did an amazing job.

Approximately how many PPQG members were there?

I believe we had about 210 members

How long have you been quilting and what is your favorite part of quilting?

I've been quilting since 2003 and my favorite part of quilting is actually designing my own quilts. I enjoy figuring out how to work out the design. I use EQ7.

What do you hope to see happen in the future for PPQG?

I hope that PPQG can once again host big name speakers. I miss that. It was one of the things I really enjoyed. I also hope that we can continue to have small workshops teaching basic quilting skills.

Paper piecing class is planned for February by Yvette Cienski and Flying Geese by Nancy Shrout is planned for March. Sharon asked for volunteers to teach Celtic Knots. Machine Appliqué and Hand Appliqué for future workshops.
- Carol Pittman-Membership-reminded members that in order to get your name in the printed roster, please pay your dues this month.
- Janet Dyer-Challenge Quilts-If you submitted your name, statement for the 2014 Ugly Fabric Challenge to be placed in the 2015 Mid-Atlantic Quilt Festival, please bring your quilt to the February meeting. If Janet is not at the meeting, Jenny Ballou will collect the quilts for her. Quilts can be picked up on Sunday after Mid-Atlantic has ended.
- 2015 Challenge-Yvette Cienski-The requirements for the 2015 Challenge are: the quilt can be no larger than 30" X 30"
- and must use 30's reproduction fabric plus one background. Patriotic Service Quilts (formerly QOV) Pat Wright and Anne Jones from New Kent County donated 921 signature blocks to our Guild (Pat McGough) for the guild to use to create more Quilts for Soldiers. Their guild is having a quilt show on April 25th, they will send us flyers with the details
- Service-Gala Damato-A thank you note was received from Sharon Evans of Portsmouth Naval Hospital for the Bereavement Quilts that our guild has provided. Our Guild is in need of more Bereavement quilts; the sizes needed are approximately 16" square up to 22" square. Natasha House has a new family with four children, boy-8 years old, girl 7-years old and a 3 year old. A quilt has already been given to the infant in the family
- Trisha Lent has a guild guilt that needs volunteers to hand guilt it. If you would like to take it home with you and work on it, please see Trisha.
