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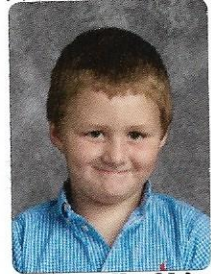

We're focusing on resources and technology. We have a science test next Tuesday. In history, we are working on communities, focusing on different cultures. We have a history test next Thursday. 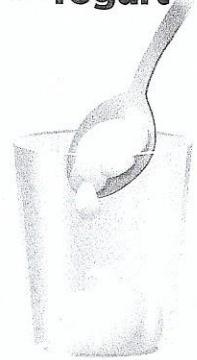

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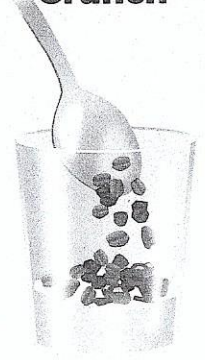

**1 Start With Yogurt**



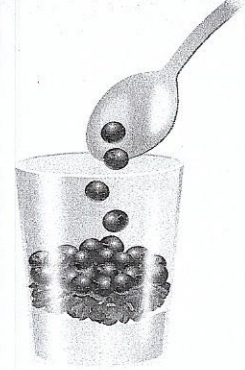
Spoon yogurt into your cup.

**3 Pick Fruit**



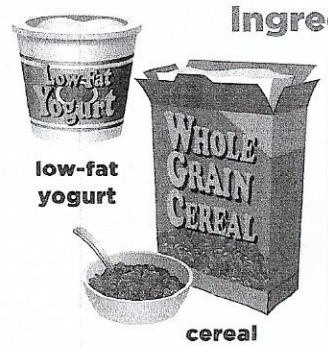
Add some fruit on top of the cereal.

**4 Make a Pattern**



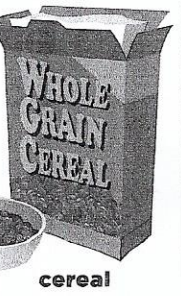
Add more yogurt, then cereal, then fruit.
