EVENTS IN BAHRAIN

On November 28th, the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquites held a closing event for their program of 2018. The program was titled "Muharraq, Capital of Islamic Culture" and was held at the Bahrain National Theatre. This took place folling its designation by the Islamic Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization. (ISESCO) Al Muharraq was awarded this title as a result of the history of the city, its heritage, and its distinctive features of Bahrain. There were many notable guests in attendance including Her Excellency, Shaikha Mai bint Mohammed Al Khalifa.

The UNESCO King Hamad Bin Isa Al-Khalifa Prize for the Use of Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) in Education continues to accept applications for the use of ICTs in education. The two awards that will be granted will be accompanied by a reward of \$25,000.

Q: How did Bahrain and the United States' relationship start?

A: More than 100 years ago, American missionaries began coming to the Gulf region. A missionary by the name of Samuel Zwemer ended up staying in Bahrain a while and ended up co-founding the American Mission Hospital. With a single step, he heighted the vision of a health service for Bahrain. Bahrainis noticed and will never forget the care American missionaries have shown our country.

Q: How did ABFS start?

A: In some ways, ABFS reflects that first encounter with American missionaries. Bahrain and the United States both welcome each other with open arms and we hope to make each a better country for its citizens. ABFS is a meeting place for friends that have been touched by Bahrain in some way. The ABFS provides the connection between American and Bahraini culture that so many enjoy.

Q: Why is AFBS important?

A: His Majesty King Hamad Bin Isa Al-Khalifa has always showed an keen interest in further developing the long lasting relationship between our peoples. One of the core duties I was requested by His Majesty to carry out was the revitalization of the ABFS, and I see many opportunities to do so. Due to the booming business investments in Bahrain, the number of Americans that live there is only going to increase. Amazon Web Services is opening their Middle East hub in Manama for example. This is bringing a large amount of jobs to Bahrain and those jobs draw on the expertise of some Americans to fill those roles. Thus, as Bahrain and United States relations further overlap, it is key that we continue to foster the affinity both countries have for the other.

Q: What is the United States' connection to the Bahrain School?

A: The Bahrain School is operated by the Bahrain International School Association with the help of the United States Department of Defense Education Activity. It has hundreds of students from kindergarten all the way to 12th grade. Students that graduate earn an American diploma. It is the only U.S. DOD school in the Arabian Gulf.

O: What is a lesser-known fact that Bahrain and the United States share?

A: I have heard from many Americans that they are first surprised by the religious freedom in Bahrain. They assume the entire Middle East is not open to different ways of thinking and that is not true. Currently, a new Catholic Cathedral that seats 2,000 people is being built in Manama for example. All religions are welcome in Bahrain, just like in America.

Q: Tell me about your time in Bahrain?

A. During my time in Bahrain working for the 4th and 5th fleet, I became very close friends with the Amir, Shaikh Isa bin Salman Al Khalifa. Our friendship allowed us to comfortably share opinions on a multitude of subjects and to this day, I cherish the wonderful memories of watching his son, His Majesty, the King, Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa grow into the courageous man he is today. After I retired from the Navy in 1997 and moved back to the United States, I dreamed of somehow being reconnected to the Kingdom. After learning about the American Bahraini Friendship Society, I immediately fell in love with the mission and decided it was the perfect opportunity to personally reconnect with the country as well as a place for me to share my stories.

Q: How has the ABFS evolved since you became involved?

We were a group of individuals passionate about a place which the majority of us had called home for many years. Although we experienced a period of rest, 2018 has been an outstanding year for us. In August, we launched a brand-new website, our first social media pages, and created way to apply and renew memberships online! Alongside the Embassy, we have hosted a vast array of events already and I am especially looking forward to attending the Bahraini National Day celebration in Washington D.C. on December 6th at the Library of Congress.

Q: What are some events which you have seen the ABFS hold?

Being home to our Fifth Fleet and a major ally in international relations, the U.S. is a shoulder for the Kingdom of Bahrain to lean on and vice versa. As military entities, we have especially expressed our gratitude for one another through the care of each other's ships and military personnel. Since 1990, the American Bahraini Friendship Society has done a phenomenal job in increasing awareness of the Kingdom of Bahrain in the United States through educating citizens of both countries and thus eliminating misconceptions.

Q: How do you envision the future of the American Bahraini Friendship Society?
