Covid Masks

We realize a lot of you are already making face masks for family, friends and other organizations. We recently became aware of a need at Riverside. Since they allow our Night Chapter meetings to be held at the Warwick Riverside Conference Center at no cost, the PPQG Board voted to help Riverside with their need of face covers.

Riverside is in need of homemade face covers for use by their skilled nursing facility residents to help decrease any chance of transmitting the virus even if showing no symptoms. This allows the medical grade masks and other protective equipment to be saved for the health care workers interacting with COVID-19 patients in our hospitals. Riverside will wash and process all of the face covers before they are distributed.

Face covers should be made with two layers of tightly woven 100 percent cotton fabric. They will take the pleated or fitted masks. They can be made with ties or elastic. As elastic to make them is not readily available, another option is to utilize elastic hair bands cut in half. It works best if you cut the band in half and sew to one side of the mask. There is no need for a wire nose piece. On Riverside's website under COVID 19/ Ways to help there are four patterns and tutorials but any pattern will do.

I will pick up face covers and deliver to Riverside for the next three weeks. You can leave them on your porch to follow safe distancing procedures. Their current need is for three thousand so any you make will help. You can call, text or email me to pick up face covers.

LIBRARY: Lisa Hartman gave a report on the library. The current books in the library are still on sale for a donation for new books. She has already ordered some of the new books and as soon as the old inventory is gone she will start signing out the newer books. Books that were donated to the chapter from guest speakers and members will still be available to all members.
