

John Piper on the Coronavirus

It matters little what we think about the coronavirus. But it matters forever what God thinks. He is not silent about what He thinks. Scarcely a page in the Bible is irrelevant for this crisis.

Our voice is grass. His is granite. "The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever" (1 Peter 1:24–25). His words in Scripture "cannot be broken" (John 10:35). What He says is "true, and righteous altogether" (Psalm 19:9). Listening to God, and believing Him, is



like building your house on a rock, not sand (Matthew 7:24). His voice is not only true; it is perfectly wise for every situation. "He is wonderful in counsel and excellent in wisdom" (Isaiah 28:29). "His understanding is beyond measure" (Psalm 147:5). When He gives counsel about the coronavirus, it is firm, unshakable, lasting. "The counsel of the Lord stands forever" (Psalm 33:11). "His way is perfect" (2 Samuel 22:31).

God's words in these times are not only true and wise; they are also precious and sweet. "More to be desired are they than gold . . . sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb" (Psalm 19:10). They are the sweetness of life: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). And with indestructible life come words of unshakable peace and joy: "Your words became to me a joy and the delight of my heart" (Jeremiah 15:16).


And the sweetness is not lost in this moment of bitter providence not if we have learned the secret of "sorrowful, yet always rejoicing" (2 Corinthians 6:10). The secret is this: Knowing that the same sovereignty that could stop the coronavirus and doesn't, is the very sovereignty that sustains the soul in it. Indeed, more than sustains — sweetens with hope that, for those who trust Him, His purposes are kind, even in

As I write this, it is about a week after the World Health Organization has proclaimed the Coronavirus a Pandemic situation. We have watched the news as people have responded with fear and panic. Hoarding of certain items has become common, grocery shelves are bare, restaurants are closed to seating customers, schools are closed for several weeks and rumors that many may not hold in person classes for the rest of the year, at least one college in the area has cancelled commencement and another is postponing it. I know individuals who are impacted by the cancellation or postponing of conferences. Weddings and funerals are being delayed. stock market appears to be in a tailspin.

Every day we are hearing of more cases of the coronavirus and the loss of life of those infected. Health officials seem to be a loss for how to slow down the spread of this virus. Several cities and even some states have effectively imposed a lock down on citizens. There are travel and quarantine restriction on those that travel out of the country. Airplanes are traveling nearly empty. One airline reports they have cut seventy percent of their flights. We are being told to keep gatherings to less than 10 people which has caused many churches (including ours) to cancel services.

Is it any wonder that people without hope feel helpless? We need to open our Bibles to see what God has to say to us during perilous times.

1 Timothy 1:1 "Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by command of God our Savior and of Christ Jesus our hope," Our hope is in Jesus Christ and Him alone. While God may use human means to supply our needs, our hope is in Christ. Our time on earth is short; our eternal hope is Christ alone.

Psalm 118:6 "The LORD is on my side; I will not fear." If God is by my side, I have no reason to fear. God is always with those who believe and nothing can harm that is not God's will for us.

- Isaiah 41:13-14 "For I, the LORD your God, hold your right hand; it is I who say to you, "Fear not, I am the one who helps you. Fear not, you worm Jacob, you men of Israel! I am the one who helps you, declares the LORD; your Redeemer is the Holy One of Israel." God is holding us, guiding us and protecting us; why be fearful?
- Psalm 39:7 "And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in You." We sing, "My hope is in you Lord, My hope is in you", but it is one thing to sing it, another to practice it. If God really is our hope, why do we fear? Why do we worry?
- Psalm 56: 3-4 "When I am afraid, I put my trust in You. In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can flesh do to me?" The things of this world cannot add or take away from the eternally glory that belongs to all who believe. Sing and praise God as means of expressing our trust in Him.
- Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make straight your paths." Trust God, not what we understand, not what we see, not what others tell us, but trust God and He will quide us.



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2Timothy 1:7 "For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control." Fear does not come from God but from Satan, we need to let go of fear and claim the power we already have from God.

There are many more passages that could be included (actually there is an entire book of books that I can introduce you to), but for the purpose of space, we will limit to this handful. The point is that no matter what is going on around us, we need to not panic or be in fear. Rather, we need to trust God and look to Him for guidance.

I am told that some translations contain 365 verses with the phrases "Fear not" or "Do not be afraid", that is one for every day of the year. For those that live in fear, it might be a good practice to make one of these the verse of the day. We are constantly told in scripture to trust God. Do we? This is a time that we should take the opportunity to turn our fears into trust.

God has given us a mind to reason, so we need to make reasonable precautions, but God is our trust. As the Psalmist penned "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the LORD our God." (Psalm20:7)

I am reminded in times like these of a hymn we used to sing:

My Hope is built on Nothing Less Edward Mote (1834)

My hope is built on nothing less Than Jesus' blood and righteousness. I dare not trust the sweetest frame, But wholly trust in Jesus' Name.

When darkness seems to hide His lovely face, I rest on His unchanging grace. In every high and stormy gale, My anchor holds within the veil.

(Chorus) On Christ the solid Rock I stand, All other ground is sinking sand; All other ground is sinking sand.

In this time of uncertainty, we know that God holds the future. This is not to say that friends, family, or we ourselves will not suffer or even die from this virus, we can be certain of one thing, it is within God's perfect will for lives. We still need to make reasonable precautions.

Do you trust in God during this time? Or, are you being fearful? This is a time to show our faith in action, are you doing so? This is a time to put aside fear, let us put our trust in God.

New Church Facebook Page



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death.

"Behold the kindness and severity of God" (Romans 11:22). His providence is sweet and bitter. Naomi did not sin when she said, "The Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me" (Ruth 1:20). That was true. And it was spoken at the very moment when all her fortunes were about to change.

This is not a season for sentimental views of God. It is a bitter season. And God sent it. We know this, because He "works all things according to the counsel of his will" (Ephesians 1:11). All things. Not a sparrow falls to the ground apart from our heavenly Father (Matthew 10:29).

Nature is not sovereign. Satan is not sovereign. Sinful man is not sovereign. God rules them all (Luke 8:25; Job 1:12; 2:6; Acts 4:27–28). So, we say with Job, "I know that You can do all things, and that no purpose of Yours can be thwarted" (Job 42:2).

Therefore, God not only comprehends the coronavirus; he has purposes for it. God does nothing, and permits nothing, without wise purposes. Nothing *just happens*. Everything flows from the eternal counsels of God (Ephesians 1:11). All of it is wisdom. All of it is purposeful. For those who trust Jesus Christ, all of it is kindness. For others, it is a merciful wake-up call: "Let the one who is thirsty come; let the one who desires take the water of life without price" (Revelation 22:17).

Our hope and prayer in the resources below, which we plan to supplement weekly, is that we might be of some help in anchoring your soul in the word of God. That you might see the greatness and beauty and worth of Jesus Christ (Philippians 3:8). That you might treasure him above health and life (Psalm 63:3). And that God would be glorified in you, as you are satisfied in Him.


This I call to mind, and therefore I have hope:

Pat Answers What Happens When You Die?

In January this question came up at an ordination hearing and more recently at a middle school youth group meeting. Many today think that when you die, that is it, you are dead, meaning you cease to exist. This is even the view of Bart Ehrman, chairman of the department of religion at the University of North Carolina, who has authored many recent books attacking "traditional" Christianity. New Age and Eastern religions teach that there is a process of purification of the soul that happens through many lifetimes called reincarnation. In the last couple weeks Grandville, MI pastor Rob Bell has a new book out called "Love Wins." Rob Bell (of Nooma DVD fame) embraces the teaching that all humans will eventually be taken into heaven because God is love and "love wins." This is an increasingly popular view in our world today. But as Jesus asked: "what saith the Scriptures?"

The Bible teaches "it is appointed unto man once to die, and after this the judgment." - Hebrews 9:27. This clearly rules out any kind of reincarnation system and emphasizes the importance of our life now to really come to know Christ! The Bible also teaches that there is big difference between the one who dies "in Christ" (linked to Jesus as Savior by faith alone) and those who die without Christ. This life is not all there is. We will live on after death in one of two places – Matthew 7:13,14; 25:46. For those who are trusting Christ they will never be separated from their Savior, not even in death – "he who dies, yet shall he live" – John 11:25, 26. To die "is to be with Christ. which is far better" - Philippians 1:23. "To be absent from the body is to present with the Lord"! - 2 Corinthians 5:8. The Christian who dies will live on with Christ and will be part of the coming resurrection unto glory – 1 Thessaloni-

ans 4:13-18.

But for the unbeliever, those not trusting in Jesus, there will be "wailing and gnashing of teeth", "outer darkness", and suffering - Matthew 13:40-42, 49-50; 22:13; Luke 16:23. The unbeliever's soul/spirit lives on and awaits the final judgment and the "second death" - a body fit for eternal damnation in Hell - Revelation 14:9-11; 20:14, 15. There is no second chance after death. This is not "happy" or popular teaching but it is the clear teaching of the Bible and of our loving Lord Jesus. Jesus loves us enough to warn us to flee from the wrath to come. The only refuge is HIMSELF! It truly is not what you know, but WHO you know. You don't want to die without Jesus. The only question that really matters then is "are you trusting in Jesus Christ as your Savior?" If not, run to Him now by faith and call on Him to save you through His death for your sins on the cross, and His resurrection unto eternal life.

As we come afresh to celebrate Easter and the empty tomb of Jesus, let us rejoice that because of Jesus, those who are trusting in Him will live now and forever. Jesus conquered death once for all. Because He arose, we will too. Let us now live and share the good news of life in Jesus. We look forward to His second coming when He brings the time of no more death, sorrow, pain, suffering, and tears! Even so, come quickly, Lord Jesus.
