

From Fr. Francisco's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

In the Gospel today we listen about the Wedding at Cana. It is very interesting the setting during which Jesus Christ performs his first sign. They are all invited to this wedding, Jesus and his apostles and his mother. It happens that they ran out of wine. This posses a question for all of us. Have you ran out of wine? We all start life, marriage, new job, new year, etc... full of good intentions and through them seeking joy. However, we find very fast that we are out of "wine", of desire, of will, of joy. One example is marriage; you prepared the wedding cere-



mony and reception. It was beautiful but soon start realizing that to love your spouse is not as simple as it seems. At that point many couples start thinking that love disappeared and want to give up — no more "wine". It is at this point that what the Virgin Mary said to Jesus is important: "Do whatever he tells you". A new wine needs to appear in order to make the marriage work. For this reason, it is fundamental that Jesus is in the middle of every marriage. A good way to do this is attending talks or catechesis on marriage. St. Joseph in East Rutherford will start February 1 at 8 PM in the convent a series of talks for engaged couples and married couples; they will run weekly on Fridays at the same time.

Also, we are having our Sweet Heart Tricky Tray on February 1 and I hope everyone can participate and attend. I will give a Protecting God's Children class on January 24 at 7 PM in Spanish for all volunteers as this is a mandatory requirement.


