## Lighting of the Advent Candle

*Celebrant:* Dear Friends in Christ, today and until Christmas, we abbreviate our usual service order in order to incorporate special Advent prayers. We also emphasize the hymns of the Advent season. Advent is a time of recollection and expectancy. It invites our remembrance of Christ's birth into our world. It also calls us to expectancy as we await his return.

## Week One – The Candle of Hope

*Reader:* The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous



Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: "The Lord is our righteousness." (*Jeremiah 33:14-16*)

Celebrant: Advent is here.

Today we join with sisters and brothers around the world, lighting candles to mark the first steps of our Advent journey. We light the Candle of Hope. Although the world seems dark and cold, we trust that Christ's light is coming. The face of our Lord will shine, and we shall be saved!

*People:* Testifying against all suffering and darkness, we kindle this light. Together, we proclaim to the world that, in Christ, we have hope.

Celebrant: Holy God,

*People:* You have promised to bring salvation and justice to the whole of creation. As we await the arrival of the Christ, may we live as those already redeemed by your grace – and may we share that grace with others.
