Pat Delaney is an award winning quilter from New England, specializing in color, home machine quilting, appliqué, and embroidery. Her quilts have won First Place Traditional in Houston, Best of Show, Best Machine Quilting, Best Color, many blue ribbons in national shows, and her quilt "The Ancient Mariner at Sunrise" won Best of World in 2007. In addition, her quilts have appeared in national publications such as American Quilter, Quilters Newsletter Magazine, Quilt, American Patchwork and Quilting, two covers for the AQS Book Catalog, and five editions of Quilt Art Calendar. She has just finished her first Craftsy tutorial on free-motion quilting on a domestic machine. Pat is a Massachusetts College of Art graduate—she has two grown daughters, one grandson, and resides in Abington, Massachusetts with her husband, Matt.

Thursday, 12 November Fills, Feathers, and Fancies

Tired of the same old stippling? Perk up your machine quilting with a new vocabulary of designs for filling spaces and backgrounds. With more than fifty designs made to fit narrow borders, triangular patches or background areas, you will have no trouble broadening your design ideas. This type of heirloom quilting is done with little or no marking. You will end up with a portfolio of stitches to get your creativity flowing.



Saturday, 14 November Iced Blueberries



Make a beautiful two color quilt with a pieced center, flowing border and a shark tooth edge. Techniques, besides piecing, include paper pieced edge and fused blanket stitch appliqué.

A two color quilt is an absolute classic, always beautiful and timeless. This beauty works in a two fabric scheme or a two color collection of

many fabrics. Pat's original border flows around the quilt edge with berries, flowers and leaves framing the pieced half square triangle blocks. The finishing touch is the tiny shark tooth border that complements the center blocks.

- After Show and Tell, the meeting was adjourned at 12:10.

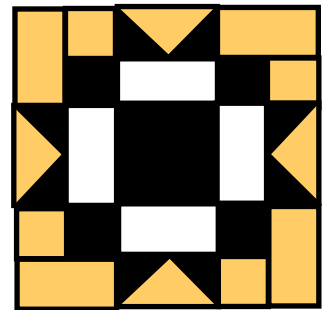

BLOCK OF THE MONTH for OCTOBER 2015 ... BLACK AND TAN*, 12" (finished)



* If anyone knows the official name of this block, please let us know! We can't find it in any of our books! For now, we are calling it "Black and Tan."

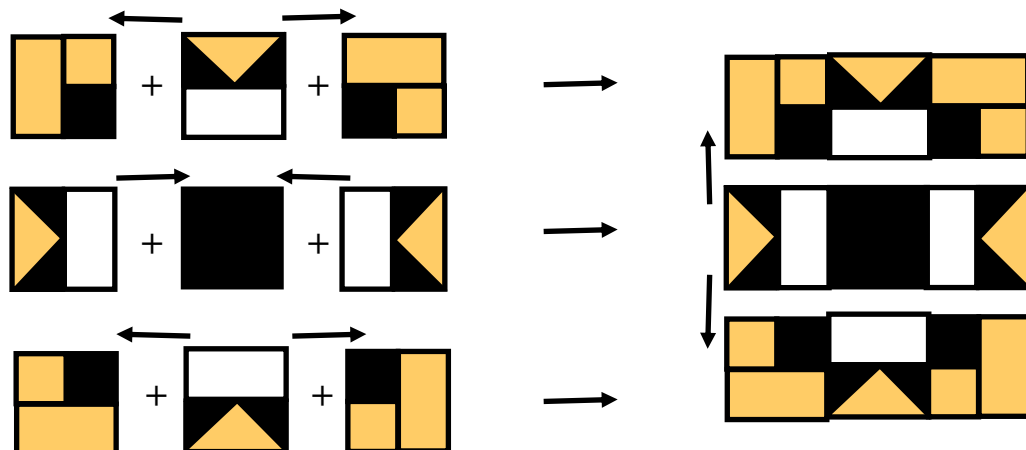
Your kit should contain: ONE $4\frac{1}{2}$ " black square, FOUR $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " cream rectangles, FOUR $2\frac{1}{2}$ " tan squares, EIGHT $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " tan rectangles, and TWELVE $2\frac{1}{2}$ " black print squares. PLEASE STRIVE VERY HARD FOR AN ACCURATE $\frac{1}{4}$ " SEAM ALLOWANCE ... If you find you are having difficulty getting the $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam, www.learnhowtoquilt.com has good videos, as both a refresher and some good tips. We all know how frustrating it can be to have a block not come out the way you had hoped!

1. Make the large flying geese units. On the wrong side of eight of the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " black squares, draw a diagonal. Place right sides together on one of the tan rectangles so that it looks like this:

 Stitch ON THE LINE. See **PIECING TIP #1**. Press toward black. Repeat on 3 more rectangles. Trim seam allowance underneath these units. Now place another black square on the opposite side so that it looks like this:

 Again stitch on line, press toward black, trim underneath. The point where the two black triangles meet should be $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edge. **Save those cut triangles if you wish, and return them to us, and someday a Monthly Mini will appear from them!**
2. Stitch a cream rectangle to each flying goose unit so that it looks like this. Press toward the cream. There should be four!

3. Make corner units. Stitch together a black $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square to a tan $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Press toward tan. Now stitch a tan rectangle to the left of each of these units. AGAIN press toward tan. Resulting units (4) should look like this:

4. Assemble block. Lay out in rows, paying attention to the orientation of the corner blocks (this way the pressed seams will all "butt" together and make assembly easier). Stitch the 3 rows, placing the large black square in the center. Then stitch the rows together. Follow direction of the arrows to press.



PIECING TIP #1. When stitching along the diagonal, begin at the rectangle edge instead of the pointed corner. Less chance for the fabric to be dragged into the feed dogs!

- **Fall Festival**—Susan Waddles thanked everyone who had volunteered, even though the event was cancelled. Susan returned the quilts that had been donated for our display.
- **Pins**—Yvette Ciencki has logo and other Guild-related pins for sale.
- **Treasurer**—Rhonda Gianturco explained that if anyone has an expense for the upcoming year's budget, write up a proposal and give it to her. We are also looking for income sources.

- **Door Prizes** Isobel Meekins drew some door prizes.

Speakers

- Kitty Tully introduced the speakers: Carol Nourse, Raquelle Hill, and Helen Heyes. All three speakers are members of our Guild.

Helen Heyes showed her quilts first. She said she enjoys doing scrappy quilts. Among the quilts Helen showed were: Grandmother's Flower Garden, Churn Dash, Pinwheel, Four Patch, Rolling Stars, and Trail Mix. Helen has directions for the Disappearing Pinwheel on her blog, www.heyeshome.net/tutorials. She will be teaching her Feathered Stars quilt at Symposium.

Raquelle Hill showed several quilts pieced by her great-grandmother and grandmothers, including a double wedding ring pattern containing the children's clothing. A few quilted jackets made from sweatshirts were next. Then Raquelle showed several of her quilts, including a Cathedral Window, a Buckeyed Beauty, a star quilt from blocks she won at a Guild meeting, and Friendship Stars. Raquelle encouraged us to make a quilt with a group of quilter friends.

Carol Nourse said she likes scrappy quilts. She has given most of her quilts away, so she showed the ones she still has. Her Hawaiian quilt is made from fabric she bought

in Hawaii. She made a chain link with apple fabric because she went to JMU, which is in apple country. One quilt honors her service in the Army. She bought fabric in Germany and made a Christmas tree quilt with appliques, crystals, etc. It won an award at our last quilt show, and was also shown in Richmond. Carol told us about the 24 quilts she made for members of her husband's family. She brought her tiny sewing machine that her mother gave her when she was 10 years old-- she still uses it.

- Isobel Meekins thanked our talented speakers.
- **Monthly Mini Winners**—Sandra Combs won the leaf table runner. Jeanne Harrison won the pumpkin fabric table runner. Kitty Tully won the skeleton, but she said she won the skeleton at the day meeting, so Isobel drew Cathy Strock's name. The Guild made \$70.00.
- **Show and Tell**—Five members showed their quilts.
- **Door Prizes**—Isobel Meekins drew the remaining door prizes.
- **Adjourn**—Isobel Meekins adjourned the meeting at 8:20 P. M.
