

ACTIVITY DAY BLOCK


Hourglass Block

The block for April is the Hourglass, I thought it would be good to make them in White and a Spring Print.

Bring (2) 10 inch squares. One white and one a Spring Print or Spring Color.

- 1. Sew around the outside edge of the block with ¼" seam.
- 2. Cut diagonally, corner to corner the make a large X on the block. You should have 4 half-square triangles when done cutting.
- 3. Press the 4 half-square triangles open.
- 4. Arrange to make an Hourglass Block.
- 5. Square the block up.

Bring an extra set of blocks if you would like to do the demo with Vilene. She will be cutting the Hourglass Block up and rearranging it into a Tulip Block. Come join the fun!!

Greeters for the evening were Terry Miller, Kathleen Billingsley and Lois Grutta.

Quilt raffle ticket sales were handled by Catherine Bilyard.

Barbara noted for new attendees the various stations around the room for NIQ activites including the 50/50 raffle, community service, membership table, greeters, library, kitchen and raffle quilt. She called on visitors and new members to stand and introduce themselves.

Newsletter: Barbara announced several people read the newsletter and entered the drawing. The winner was Janet Funk who won a heart pin made by Barbara.

Announcements: INMQ meets in Liberty Lake every other month and is hosting Karen Marchetti 3/21 for a one day workshop and trunk show. Flyers will be at the front table.

Everett, WA has a quilt show in May, flyer at the front table.

Tri Cities 37th annual quilt show is March 20-21, flyers at front table.

WSQ yard sale will be March 28 at Spokane Falls Community College in Spokane.

The National Quilts of Valor Sew Day will be Feb 1st at the Legion Hall in Post Falls.

The Australia animal rescue sew site is temporarily on hold for inventory.

Sew Expo at Puyallup Fairgrounds is 2/27-3/1. Contact Shelley Noordam if interested in car pooling.

Minutes: no corrections. The minutes were approved as read.

Treasurer's Report: Checking: \$20,569.78 (\$1835.00 for retreat), Savings: \$1027.82, Banner Bank CD: #14,101.38. Cindie reminded members her term ends in October and she would like to train the next treasurer ahead of that date. Please contact her if you are interested in serving as treasurer.

Committee Chair updates: Barbara announced that Nona Kay Barclay will conduct the audit this year. Meg Haywood will be program chair and Sally Clouse will chair the yard sale. Vacancies still remain for historian, quilt raffle ticket sales and a team is needed to make the next raffle quilt.

Committee Reports:

Activity Day: Vilene announced the next Activity Day is Feb 8, at Calvary Lutheran Church in Post Falls. Bring project s and pot luck. The new mystery quilt will be starting, \$10 for the year and requires 3 fabrics. Quilts to tie for community service will be at activity day.

Historian: Carlene Litz has completed the historian book and encouraged members to take a look at all NIQ has accomplished this last year.

Kids Camp: Carlene reported the dates for camp are Aug 3-7, price is the same and they are preparing kits.

Community Service: Catherine brought a box with cut bundles to sew for community service, members encouraged to take a bundle home. She donated 8 quilts to Safe Passage and Harmony House. If members wish to donate tops to community service, twin and double size are the most usable, especially kid themed. Baby quilts tend to be used as play mats. Catherine noted a quilt was requested by a Disabled Vets organization to raffle. She has a quilt top needing machine quilting and called for a volunteer. Shirley Koning volunteered.

Quilt Show: Michele is working on the current budget for the show. The North Idaho Quilters quilt show will be June 18&19, 2021 and Paulette Steele is the featured quilter. Michele requested a volunteer assistant to work with Kathleen Billingsley for the country store.

Retreats: Kathleen reported the spring quilt retreat is at Palouse Divide and 17 people are registered. There is room for 3 more, double room occupancy.

Yard Sale: Sally reported she is looking for a facility to host the yard sale and the date will be in Sept. She called for committee volunteers and the following members will help: Vilene Chaney, Diana Swindle, and Linda Cathey.

50/50 Raffle: Sue reported the raffle is \$108 at this time of the meeting, tickets still available.

Membership: Patty reported we have 164 members, 71 present tonight, 4 guests and 4 new members.

Hospitality: Pam stated there are lots of goodies, keep the line moving.

Basket Raffle: Debra Holmes and Linda Horstman reminded members to be thinking of basket raffle items and silent auction items for the July event.

Adjournment: A motion to adjourn the meeting at 6:39 made by Vilene Chaney, second by Andi Schoutens, motion carried.

The 50/50 winner was Cindie Lee for \$85.50

Show and Tell was held.

Presentation for the evening was Quilting by the Experts with Sally Clouse, handquilting; Arless Scheet, domestic machine quilting and Jill Good, long arm quilting.
